
In Audio Visual Production, students completed their first project which is an autobiography recording. Students were introduced to the Audio Visual Production process and will continue using the process to develop various productions.




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STEM/MATH NEWS...

class. We will be reviewing colors and numbers in both oral and written form.





HEALTH NEWS...
