

BUSINESS TECHNOLOGY NEWS...

Business Technology students will continue the 6-week Keyboarding Unit. Students will be required to keyboard twenty minutes daily throughout the six-week period. Students will take two keyboarding assessments and two-timed writing/speed assessments. Additionally, Students will be assigned keyboarding homework in an effort to improve their keyboarding proficiency. We will use a web-based keyboarding program that will provide opportunities for student to reinforce their keyboarding skills at home.

Lastly, 6th grade students will begin the Computer Fundamentals Unit. 7th Grade students will begin the Computer Applications Unit with an emphasis on Microsoft Word . 8th grade students will begin the Career Pathways Unit. 8th Grade students will craft a resume and cover letter based upon their chosen

Career. All classes will take quizzes on Thursday and Friday.. Students received study guide notes in class last week..


In Audio Visual Production, students completed their first project which is an autobiography recording. Students were introduced to the Audio Visual Production process and will continue using the process to develop various productions.



will continuing reviewing colors and numbers in both oral and written form.




