**Course Description:** Geometry is the second course in a sequence of three required high school courses designed to ensure career and college readiness. The course represents a discrete study of geometry with correlated statistics applications. Honors courses will include more in depth instruction and higher rigor in classwork and assessments.

**Special Assignments and Projects:** Projects will be completed at various times to provide students with additional opportunities to demonstrate mastery of concepts. Details will be distributed as they are assigned.

### **Remote Learning Expectations**

#### **I. Attendance and Communication Expectations**

### **School-wide Grading Requirements as follows (semester grading):**

#### **Semester Final Average:**

Final exam or EOC/Milestone Assessment- 9<sup>th</sup>- 12<sup>th</sup> grade level courses- 20%  
Practice Work (examples include: classwork, homework, formative items, quizzes): 40%  
Assessment Tasks (examples include: labs, summative assessments, major tests/projects): 40%

\*Grades for each 9 week grading period should include a minimum of the following: 3 tests in the Assessment Task category, 3 labs/quizzes in Practice Task category and 9 Practice Work grades.

### **Recovery: Odysseyware**

Students will have the opportunity to complete remediation on tests via Odysseyware to replace/improve the grade. NO RETESTS. Students will have two weeks following the return of the graded test to complete the remediation. Upon completion of the designated Odysseyware assignment, the grade earned will replace the existing grade in Infinite Campus (100% complete required). Failure to complete the entire list of assignments will result in no grade change.
