St. Augustine Youth Services

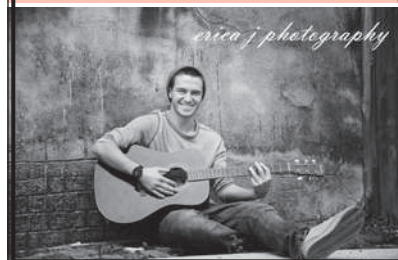

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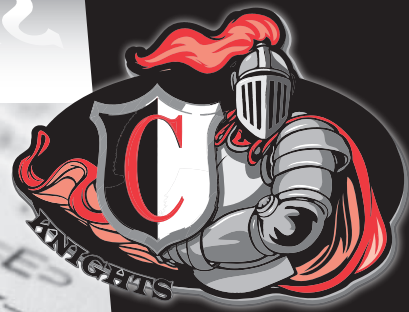

Civil Engineering Club

On the crisp morning of Saturday, February 15th, members of Creekside High School's Civil Engineering club joined with the St. Johns County Housing Partnership and the Trinity Episcopal "Ramp Squad" to assist an elderly man disabled from the time that he was a teenager, at no cost to him.

Robert Birkett, shot in the head in a gun accident while hunting with his friends, has been disabled since he was 16 years old. A mechanic throughout his life, he used only his left hand in his trade, as his right side was paralyzed. Now, at the age of 90, it is extremely difficult for him to get up and down the steps to his house. We volunteered to help with the house's accessibility.

From morning to mid-afternoon, the Ramp Squad and Creekside's engineering students constructed the ramp. Following hand-drawn plans modified specifically for this project by the Squad and their volunteer group, they cut, nailed, and sanded the ramp into existence using the materials and tools provided by the Partnership. A Ramp Squad member, Rocky, stated that "we [build] about one or two ramps a month," and that he's helped to build over 200 ramps in his time with the organization.

There were, however, a few challenges that the volunteers faced while building. There were times when the ramp's boards needed to be redone because of misalignment. Because of the position of the house and the ramp's handrail, the nail gun could not fit in the space used to attach the railing's pickets. Through these trials, though, the Squad and engineering students used their experience and problem solving skills to get past the obstacles and find different ways of building; it was the perfect opportunity to test what the students had been learning in the classroom.

The plans used for this project will be used later on in the civil engineering academy at Creekside High School, says the academy's teacher, Kevin Davenport. The engineering group wants to put these plans into a program called AutoCAD, where they can draw them and modify them to fit any future projects without having to redraw the entire plan. This, as well as the actual building of the ramp, is a great experience for the engineering students, and a job well done by them and the Ramp Squad. As for the ramp's new owner, he feels that "[there] couldn't be anything better."

Noi Non Potemo Avere Perfetta Vita Senza Amici



The Italian poet Dante Alighieri from the Middle Ages once said, "We cannot have a perfect life without friends," and this quote is quite applicable to the eye opening trip thirty Creekside students, including four teacher chaperones (Ms. Bak, Ms. Kurtz, Mr. Ray, Ms. Fornera) and some parents, went on to Italy for Spring Break of 2014. While some of the kids had already known each other, all the teachers, parents, and students were able to bond over the nine day adventure to Europe. After flying and being awake for almost thirty hours, the group landed in Venezia (Venice) on the 15th of March, where their very tall and friendly tour guide, Marco, greeted them as their anxious feet exited the airport. Since Venice is completely dependent on water transportation, the group took a ride to the Queen of the Adriatic (aka Venice) via vaporreto (the boat equivalent to the local bus

in American cities) to explore Venice and take the evening easy to alleviate any jet lag (all three cities were five hours ahead of local Jacksonville time). Only spending two days in Venice, the group went on a culture quest to learn more about the cities roots, discovered the hidden wonder of gelato, passed the Bridge of Sighs and Doge's Palace, saw the Basilica of Saint Mark, witnessed a Venetian blown glass demonstration on another island, and rode a gondola through the back water streets and parts of the Grand Canal.

On the way to Firenze (Florence), the group stopped in Bologna. They had the chance to tour the University of Bologna and have the opportunity to taste the flavors Bologna is famous for. From tortellini, to salami, to ragu, (tomato meat sauce often with sausage or beef) the group had a couple hours to explore the city before hopping on the charter bus, driving through the winding hills of Tuscany, and finally reaching Florence. In Florence, the group walked the famous Ponte Vecchio bridge that lies over the Arno river, had a chance to take panoramic pictures of Florence from high above. During the second day of Florence, the group was taken on a private walking tour to see the Duomo featuring Ghiberti's famous Baptistery Doors and the Accademia where Michelangelo's original David was held. There was also an excursion where group members could pay to learn and paint a fresco while the others shopped in open markets, ate gelato, looked at sculpture, and even climbed 463 steps to the top of the dome on the Duomo!

Finally, the group spent the last three days in Roma (Rome). However, the group took a short trip to the small, but breathtakingly beautiful town of Assisi to tour the Basilica of St. Francis, buy a few souvenirs, and eat some local sandwiches or pizza for lunch. Once in Rome, the group walked to the famous Trevi Fountain where many group members threw coins and took photos. One coin meant you would return to Rome again, two coins meant you would meet the love of your life, and three coins in the fountain was bad luck. The group had another private tour to the Vatican where they walked the Sistine Chapel and St. Peter's Basilica (which featured Michelangelo's famous Pieta). The tour guide taught them about the Pope and the religious history of Italy along with the government of the Vatican. Two excursions were featured in Rome. One excursion was a pizza making lesson followed by dinner and another was an all day trip to Pompeii to explore the city and learn about life before Mt. Vesuvius erupted. Those who did not attend the Pompeii excursion spent the day with Ms. Bak (an AP Studio Art and Art History teacher at Creekside), exploring the crypt of the Monks, some of Rome's various gardens, a lovely local lunch, shopping, and relaxing at a cafe. Then after the three days' worth of fun, it was finally time to say "ciao ciao" to Marco and Italy as the group ventured back to Jacksonville after an exciting and most memorable trip that brought people from all parts of school and their families together.

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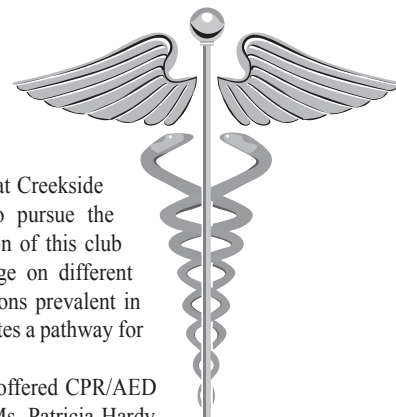

Florida State Spanish Conference 2014

Creekside High School's Spanish Department took a team of 12 students to compete at the Florida State Spanish Conference on March 13th – March 15th. Our team proudly represented the Saint John's County School District and was one of 47 schools throughout Florida to participate in this state-wide academic competition. Team members included Jonah Smith, Hayley Campbell, Talia Wind, Carlos Camacho, Alycia Willis, Sebastian Camacho, Cesar Camacho, Jamie Lee, Jackson Vance, Catherine Lower, Lucy Steele and Hayley Taylor. Each team member presented a 2 minute impromptu. Of the 12 members, 7 received a score of "sobresaliente" (outstanding and, the highest rating possible), four members received a "superior" score, the second highest rating, and one an "excelente". Nine of the members performed the play *Celestina*, a Spanish tragicomedy written in 1499 by Fernando de Rojas. The team received a "superior" score for their work. The declamations (reciting of poems in Spanish) were given by Jamie Lee, who received a "superior" score, Lucy Steele, Sebastian Camacho and Cesar Camacho, all of whom received "sobresaliente" scores. Hayley Taylor brought home a third place overall trophy for her regional *sevillana* outfit from Spain. Several students also performed instrumentals. Alicia Willis and Hayley Campbell performed a guitar duo, *La Romanza* and Jack Vance performed a saxophone solo entitled *Flamenco*. Amazing talent! As Team Sponsor, I have never felt so proud of my students. They have been practicing since September 2013 and their hard work definitely paid off.
