Those sidering a nursing career should ave a strong desire to help others, a enuine concern for the welfare of patients and clients, and an ability to deal with people of diverse backgrounds in stressful situations. If you take the sequenced health science courses recommended in this education and career plan, you can receive the Certified Nursing Assistant Credential. the Certified Patient Care Technician Credential and the American Red Cross CPR and First Aid Certification upon graduation from high school. There are many and varied areas of nursing, including Certified Nursing Assistant (CAN), Licensed Practical/Vocational Nurse (LPN/LVN) and Registered Nurse (RN). Most nursing programs require education beyond high school, including diploma programs, associate degree programs, bachelor degree programs and beyond.

Once you complete all your education and training, you will insend to be licensed as an Advanced Practice Nurse, a Registered Nurse (RN), or a Licensed Nurse (RN), or a Licensed Nurse (RN), or a Licensed Nurse (RN), and in many other professions, nurses must be licensed in the state where they work. You must take the NOLEX-RNB or NOLEX-RNB license examination to become a licensed nurse.
