State Superintendent Richard Woods Presents STEM Program Certification to Rex Mill Middle School



On Monday, May 11th, Rex Mill Middle School (RMMS) formally joined an exclusive group of Georgia schools. RMMS is the first school in Clayton County to be awarded Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Program certification by the GaDOE. The certification was presented by Richard Woods, State Superintendent. Rex Mill is the second middle school to earn STEM Program designation statewide and the first to have a Healthcare Science STEM Program. The certification is an extensive on-going process conducted by GaDOE to verify specific indicators of STEM excellence implemented by the students, the staff and the community of the school.

"Team members focused on how students were solving real-world problems: innovation of a STEM lab funded by a grant from Coca-Cola and



- Mt. Zion High School and Lovejoy High School Carpentry Pathway students partnered with Southern Crescent
 Habitat for Humanity's "spring build." Both schools were honored at the Habitat Golden Hammer Awards
 Ceremony in the Student Volunteer category.
- This year's WBL Success Seminar was hosted by Clayton State University where students learned about the importance of soft skills in the workplace, networked, and took a tour of the campus.
- CTAE Achievement Ceremony at Mundy's Mill High School was attended by over 450 students, parents and guests. The ceremony recognized approximately 360 students who passed the ASSET test, which is an increase of 16% from last year, and approximately 240 students pass the End-of-Pathway-Assessment, which is an increase of from last year.
- Dan Moorer, Marketing Instructor at Forest Park High School and Harold Walker, Marketing Instructor at
 Morrow High School, engaged marketing students in a Student Challenge Pilot Program to create a new logo
 design concept for the Clayton County Water Authority (CCWA). Final selections from both schools were
 presented to the CCWA Board of Directors by the students that created the concepts. The final selection and
 logo design will be determined in July 2015.
- Rhonda Powell, Programming Pathway Instructor at Forest Park High School had students to participate in CodeHS. The workshop introduces programming and computer science principles to spark an interest in programming and coding. After the workshop, 80% of the students said they would be interested in continuing in programming courses. A student commented, "in today's ever changing world, one needs to have some type of technological background in order to navigate through devices, programs, and the world."
- Babb Middle School's FCCLA Garden Club held a workday on March 18th. Plants, tools, and materials were donated by The Home Depot, and direction was provided by Georgia Cooperative Extension Service Master Gardener's staff. Students learned to make "worm towers" for their garden as a simple and effective way to increase the health of their plants and improve soil conditions.
