The Georgia State Board of Education adopted these standards in 2010. These standards provide a consistent framework to prepare students for success in college and/or the 21st century workplace. Our students will be competitive on a global level.

As a result of the CCGPS, our students will be receive rigorous knowledge and skills needed in college and/or careers; consistent expectations across states, and relevant content and application of knowledge through high-order skills.

It also helps teachers and parents know what they need to do to help children perform and compete. And while you aren't part of the teaching staff you are just as important to your children's education as we are. Your children receive the best education when you and our dedicated teachers work as a team. We will continue to keep you informed about the Common Core Georgia Performance Standards.

We are off and running into this new school year with our uniform policy. Many of our students are present daily wearing the required uniform: khaki pants and red, white, and/or black polo shirts. I continue to need your support in making sure that we are in 100% compliance with students coming dressed in uniform.
