Work-Based Learning

21st Century WBL Vision:

Delaware students will be prepared for continuing education and competitive employment with greater access to a statewide work-based learning (WBL) system.

Goal:

By school year 2018-19, Delaware's work-based learning system will support 2,500 high school and 5,700 post-secondary students as they pursue "career immersion" experiences that are aligned with their career pathway.

WBL Guiding Principles

Achieving the vision will require a WBL system with a:

- College and Career Ready Focus;
- 2) Common Approach to Employer and School Engagement;
- 3) Workforce Intermediary Enabled Structure; and
- 4) Sustainable Approach to Growth Over Time.
