CTE Updates

- Nineteen (19) state-model CTE career pathways have been released that align to demand driven occupations, provide students with the opportunity to earn college credit and an industry recognized credential.
- Nearly 9,000 students will earn credit in 115 pathway programs in 39 high schools and 2 additional institutions that serve high school youth.
- Pathway teachers have participated in course specific professional learning in partnership with Delaware Technical Community College, Delaware State University, and the University of Delaware.
- Regulation 1559 Skilled and Technical Science was updated to provide additional opportunities for industry professionals to enter the classroom.
- Internal POS policy has been established to administer technical skill attainment measures and work-based learning opportunities.
- Approved Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) plan includes discreet career readiness measures on the Delaware School Success Framework (DSSF).
- DSSF business rules are being defined by internal working group and will be used to capture career readiness measures including: advanced credit, work-based learning, and industry credential attainment through CTE career pathways.
- Transition and placement data are being collected for CTE pathway completers through the National Student Clearinghouse and an agreement with the Delaware Department of Labor.
