OHS SAC acknowledgement of the OHS Safety Team


In light of the incidents that happened at various schools nationwide over the past couple of years, this OHS Safety Team has made several improvement measures by installing cameras, securing entry points, having police presence, diligent and continuous checking of vulnerable areas, and most importantly making student safety a priority for all OHS staff members. The team also communicated the measures widely amongst students and parents and took their feedback to make continuous improvements.

As a result, the students and parents have responded back in the safety survey and the safety score has improved by ~10% over that of last year. The safety measures undertaken at OHS has been a benchmark in the county.

It's important for our students to be safe and feel safe in an educational institution. We thank the OHS Safety Team for making this happen in a short period of time with their incredible efforts despite a number of constraints.

This week is National School Counseling Week! What a great opportunity to send a note to your counselor and thank them for their work!



Oviedo's own Kyra Henriques placed first in the Florida Junior Science & Humanities Symposium at the University of Florida! She was one of 24 competitors selected from across the state for the elite version of the symposium, the speaker competition. Kyra's research focused on using readily available oils emulsified with iron oxide to adhere to microplastic contaminants. She then utilized strong magnets to separate the aggregated pollutants from the water.

She further expounded on this research by designing a working prototype and offering details about how to apply it at scale. She showcased her research through a 12-minute presentation of her work and a 6-minute Q&A defense to a diverse panel of University of Florida faculty. Kyra was **unanimously chosen as the top competitor in the competition** and was awarded first place. This is the highest achievement any student has earned since the first Oviedo competitor was accepted in 2020. She is subsequently invited to represent the state at the National Junior Science & Humanities Symposium in Virginia in mid-April. Please congratulate Kyra Henriques for her incredible achievement! Zack Griffin and Lindsey Weber won second place in the Business Plan category at the 2023 Central Florida Hospitality Competition at UCF Rosen College of Hospitality Management! Both students are enrolled in electives in the SCVS Hospitality and Tourism program-Zack is taking the Year 1 Intro to Hospitality and Tourism class and Lindsey is taking the Year 2 Tech for Hospitality and Tourism course. Zack and Lindsey impressed the judges at the competition so much that one of the judges offered both students a paid internship this summer! We are so excited for Zack and Lindsey's amazing accomplishments!



The **Oviedo Roarbots** won the Space Coast League Championship on Saturday against 29 other teams. In challenge play the Roarbots were undefeated in six matches and ranked number one entering alliance play. As the first-place alliance captain, the Roarbots choose Uplift Robotics of Oviedo and Z.I.P. Ties of Sanford as their partners. The alliance won four straight matches to take the championship. All three teams will advance to the state competition in March. The Roarbots also won the Control Award for innovative design using sensors and software to control the robot. 

Athletics from Athletic Director Jen Darty

Boys Varsity Basketball played in the Legends Tournament at Boone on Friday & Saturday – the team lost to Lake Brantley 62-58 & lost to Central Florida Christian Academy 47-41.

Comp Cheer competed in the SAC Championships and took 5^{th} place overall. The team will compete in the State Meet on Saturday morning.

Girls Varsity Soccer defeated New Smyrna Beach 5-0 Friday night to advance to the District Final. Mackenzie Becker scored twice and Ryleigh Holcomb had a goal and two assists. Reagan Fitzgerald and Hannah Gretkowski each scored a goal in the win with Hannah Gretkowski and Kate Mikalsen both having an assist in the victory. The defense of Mia Meadows, Kate Mikalsen, Makenna Smith, Peyton White, and Emma Vanderkooy led the defense with the shutout win.

On Saturday, Boys Wrestling competed at the Timber Creek Wolfpack IBT and finished 6th out of 17 teams. We placed 7 of the 11 competing wrestlers. Congrats to the following placers 2nd Clayton Mitchell & Gunner Forsberg, 4th Johnathan Dishman & Lukas Crawley, 5th Connor Rodriguez & Joey Gioa, and 6th Gunner Essary. Also on Saturday, five of our Lady Wrestlers competed at the Lake Mary Lady Rams IBT and Hailey Mitchell placed fourth. After a first round loss, she wrestled back very well and even avenged a loss from this week in the process. Great job Hailey!

On Saturday, Girls Varsity Basketball lost to St. Cloud, 42-49. Lilly Jacobus had 16 points. JV also lost to St. Cloud, 38-30. Izzy Wollmer scored 11 points, Maleah Dupa added 9, and Ray'ah Smithers added 7.

Boys Varsity Soccer is moving on to the District Finals on Thursday after a dramatic win last night over Edgewater. Lorenzo Amaral was fouled in the box within the first 3 minutes of the game giving us the lead 1-0. With mere seconds remaining in the first half, Edgewater was able to find the back of the net for the equalizer. Neither team conceded a goal for the remainder of the game in regular time along with the two 10-minute overtimes so the game went to penalty kicks. Andrew White had an amazing save and goals were made by Lorenzo Amaral and Kosi Mafela with Javier Peña scoring the final kick to give the boys a W 3-2 in penalties.

Girls Varsity Soccer defeated Edgewater last night in double overtime to win the District Championship by a score of 2-0. After finishing regulation in a 0-0 tie and hitting the crossbar 5 times, the team finally broke through with a goal from Jada Narcisse off an assist from Reagan Fitzgerald with 3 minutes left in the first overtime. In the 2nd overtime, Reagan Fitzgerald again had another assist, but this time played an amazing through ball to Ryleigh Holcomb who went in 1 on 1 for the breakaway goal and the 2-0 win. Mia Meadows recorded the shutout with 4 saves and the defense of Kate Mikalsen, Makenna Smith, Roen Waisanen and Peyton White held the opposition scoreless throughout the 80 minutes of regulation and 20 minutes of overtime. The win also was a milestone victory with it being Coach Waisanen's 300th career win as head coach of the team. Congratulations to Coach Waisanen & the team!

Over the weekend, Boys & Girls Water Polo competed in a Preseason Classic at Seminole. The Girls team lost to Seminole, 6-8. Senior Lisa Buencamino led the lions with 3 goals while senior Karsen McKee, senior Marin Rose, and junior Bella Quintana followed up with 1 goal each. Sophomore goalie Ciel Sanabria saved the Lions with over 10 blocks. In their second game, the Girls won 14-5 over Lake Howell. Senior Karsen McKee led with 3 goals and senior Delaney

Warner, senior Marin Rose, sophomore Layla Tietig, and junior Bella Quintana all finished with two goals each. Junior Emilia Dowling, junior Caroline Krywonos, and sophomore Jane Coleman added to the tally with a goal each. The Boys team lost to Seminole 8-15 behind senior Brady Vaiarella's three goals. Sophomore Noah Tikoo and junior Trevor Francis contributed 2 goals each. Freshman Jake MacDonald showed up big in his first high school game, banking one goal for the Lions. In their second game, the Boys team defeated Lake Howell 13-4. Senior Brady Vaiarella had 5 goals while sophomore Colton White, sophomore Noah Tikoo, and sophomore Simon Gong contributed 2 goals each. Senior Lance Kochmann and junior Daniel Strumidlo had strong play in goal.

Boys Weightlifting lost to Winter Springs yesterday, 30-50. Bryce Lesser, Ethan Manning and Regis McCue all won their weight classes.

Boys JV & Varsity Basketball lost to Holy Trinity last night – JV lost 55-54, Varsity lost 64-31.

Girls Varsity Basketball lost in the District Semifinals to Lake Howell last night, 39-26. Carmen Longhurst led with 8 points.

Boys Varsity Soccer took on New Smyrna Beach last night in the District Final. The team started off strong in the first half, with Javier Peña stealing the ball from the back line and dishing it back to Lorenzo Amaral for the score. The team held their ground until the last 90 seconds when New Smyrna found the back of the net for the equalizer. In the first overtime, New Smyrna found an opportunity and went up 2-1. The Lions fought hard and had several attempts at goal but none found the net. The team finished as District Runner-Up with a 9-3-2 record for the year and await the State Tournament bracket.


