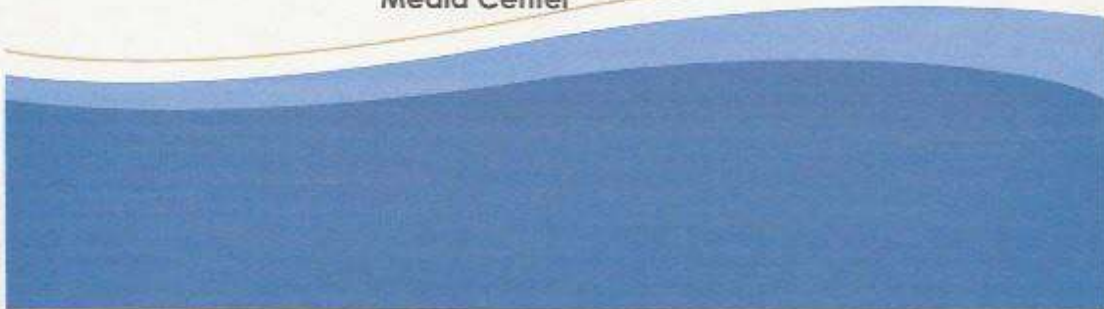

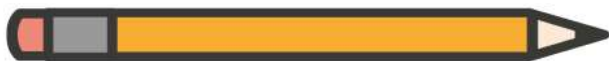

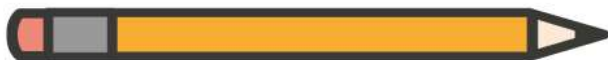

Girls Varsity Lacrosse lost to Bishop Moore 17-8, led by freshman Brooke Krapf with 3 goals and 2 goals each for senior Avery Anderson and junior Payton Pagan. The JV game ended in a 4-4 tie, led by sophomore Lily McCaslin with 2 goals and 5 draw controls.

Varsity Baseball lost 4-3 to Lake Howell on Friday. JV also lost 3-2.

Both Boys & Girls Water Polo defeated Hagerty on Friday. The Girls won 15-2 behind the strong efforts of sophomore Layla Tietig, junior Bella Quintana, senior Delaney Warner, and sophomore goalie Ciel Sanabria. The Boys won 15-10, led by senior Brady Vaiarella, sophomore Noah Tikoo, sophomore Trevor Francis, and senior goalie Lance Kochmann.

Track & Field was at Lake Mary Invitational on Saturday, where the Boys and Girls teams finished 5th and 4th respectively in a 13-team field. Sophomore Tristan Washington ran 10.77 into a strong head wind earning finishing 2nd and earning a top 10 spot in the 100m in 4A state rankings. The Boys 4 x 100m relay team jumped to a #15 ranking with a time of 42.98. The Girls 4 x 800m relay team ran a state ranked #5 time 9:59.65 placing first at the meet.

Boys Wrestling competed this weekend in the State Meet. No wrestlers placed in the top eight, and the metal round, however, Josh Sabbia and John Dishman both finish top 16 in their weight classes and Gunner Forsberg finish in the top 12 in his weight class. Boys Volleyball took on St. Augustine and East River in their Preseason Classic, winning over both 25-7, 25-8 and 25-11, 25-21, respectively.

Boys Varsity Volleyball opened up the regulars with a five-set win over Hagerty, 21-25, 25-16, 25-18, 25-27, 16-14. Nolan Pedersen had 16 kills, 5 digs & 4 aces. Archer Crowe had 14 kills, and Aiden Iversen had 12 kills, 12 digs & 2 aces. JV lost to Hagerty 0-2.

Varsity Softball lost to Apopka last night, 8-5. Riley Fennell went 2-for-4 with 3 RBIs, Madison Slavik went 3-for-4 with 1 RBI, Angelee Bueno went 2-for-4, Sophia Vanderkooy with 2-for-3, and Madison Seger had an RBI. JV fell 13-1, led by Makenzie Murray, Sophia Tinberg, Aria Minnetto.

Boys Weightlifting competed in the SAC Championship yesterday and took 4th place overall. Bryce Lesser and Regis McCue finished 2nd in their weight classes along with Isiah Cunningham who placed 3rd in his weight class.

Girls Tennis dropped a tight match against Seminole by a score of 4 - 3. No. 1 singles Keriana Cooduvalli lost 8-6 while No. 3 Marly Márquez won 8-1. Boys Tennis lost their match by a score of 7-0.

As the school year continues & winter sports have now concluded, our coaches and student-athletes have continued to produce success. We produced 16 All-Conference First Team Selections and 13 Second Team Selections in Winter Sports! We are currently 3rd in the SAC Standings with 117.5 points, which is 10.5 points off the lead. We also held over a cumulative 3.5 unweighted team GPA in Girls Soccer and Girls Basketball.

Through the school year, we have produced one individual state champion, had six teams qualify for the state finals along with ten individual qualifiers, three region champions, six district champions, and three conference champions along with 58 All-Conference First Team Selections, 36 Second Team Selections and three Coach of the Year honors in Boys Swimming, Girls Swimming & Girls Soccer.
