Essays that exceed the maximum number of words are also disqualified. Children are encouraged to use the word count of their computer's word processor. "A," "an," and "the" are considered words for the word count, and dates are considered one word.

Teachers are urged to help students with their essays and encourage correct grammar, spelling and punctuation. Essays are due by November 20th, 2020
