Daze

ADMINISTRATION

- Before handing out the worksheet to each student say, "I'm going to give you a worksheet. When you get your worksheet, please write your name at the top and put your pencil down."
- **Handout** the worksheets.
- When all students are ready, continue with the directions: say "You are going to read a story with some missing words. For each missing word there will be a box with three words. Circle the word that makes the most sense in the story. Look at Practice 1."
- A sample or model is provided to students in practice 1. Read example.
- Practice 2 allows the assessor to gauge whether or not students understand the task.
- The assessor provides the correct response for practice 2 after 30 seconds.
- Continue with the remaining directions.
- Start the stopwatch after you say "Begin".
- Use the reminders as needed.
- At the end of 3 minutes, stop the student.
- Collect the Daze worksheets.

DISCONTINUE

- If the student does not read any words correctly in the first row of the first passage, discontinue administering the passage and record a score of zero (0).
- Do not administer Retell

REMINDERS

These reminders may be used as often as needed:

- If a student starts reading the passage out loud, say, "Remember to read the story silently."
- If a student is not working on the task say
 "Remember to circle the word in each box that makes the most sense in the story."

ADMINISTRATION

DISCONTINUE

REMINDERS

Correct – (Incorrect / 2)
