

## STUDENT APPLICATION Certificate of Multiliteracy

The Delaware Department of Education has established a *Certificate of Multiliteracy* to recognize high school students who have attained a high level of proficiency in one or more languages in addition to English. Delaware high school students may apply for two levels of certificate:

- Gold Level Certificate of Multiliteracy for Intermediate-Mid level of proficiency
- **Diamond Level** Certificate of Multiliteracy for Advanced-Low level of proficiency

Your *Certificate of Multiliteracy* is a credential that can help differentiate you as an applicant for a job, college entrance or the military. Include it with your resume, college applications, and job applications. The back of the certificate outlines what valuable 21<sup>st</sup> century language skills you bring to the job market, the university or to the military.



## **Directions to Applicants:**

- 1. Complete all sections of the application. Type or print legibly all information.
- 2. Submit application and documentation of qualifying scores to your high school counselor at any time during the school year.
- 3. The DOE will process applications once at the beginning of the months of November, February, and Mav.
- 4. Allow 4 weeks for certificates to be processed and returned to your school counselor.
- 5. If you are a senior at the time of application, application must be received by the Department of Education by May 1.
