Dual Enrollment - WHAT IS IT?

- Allows students to take college coursework for credit towards both high school graduation and postsecondary requirements.
- The program is offered during all terms of the school year; fall, spring and summer semesters



ELIGIBILITY

- Students entering 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade at an eligible high school
- Students who meet college entrance requirements
 - GPA, SAT/ACT scores, age or grade levels
- Students who receive counselor's recommendation
 - Demonstrates initiative, self motivated, with good organization skills
 - Ready for college level classes



BENEFITS OF DUAL ENROLLMENT

- Prepare for transition to college
- Earn college credits while in high school
 - Up to 15 credit hours per semester
- Reduce cost of attending college
 - Program pays for tuition, books and mandatory fees
- Improve GPA 1 quality point added for Dual Enrollment courses
- Considerations
 - AP vs. Dual Enrollment College Specific
 - Transferability



WHAT ABOUT HOPE?

- Courses taken through Dual Enrollment do not apply to HOPE course limits. (HOPE applies to up to 120 credit hours)
- Dual Enrollment core courses receive a .5 quality point for HOPE GPA calculations



Steps of the Dual Enrollment process

- 1. Earn admission to the Dual Enrollment institution.
- 2. Complete the GA Futures Application online through www.gafutures.org
- 3. Meet with your Lambert High counselor to map out your courses and complete the Student Participation Agreement.
- 4. Register for your college dual enrollment courses through the college procedures.









Finish College Earlier!

- Earn college credit *while in high school* (ability to earn up to an associate)!
- Start your job search earlier or enter a graduate program earlier!

Save Money!

- Dual Enrollment college courses are paid for which saves you money later!
 - Why not get 1-2 years of college paid for?



How Much Does it Cost to Participate??

Dual Enrollment Pays For:

- Tuition (15 credit hours max per semester)
- Mandatory fees
- Required books

What Will YOU Pay For:

- Course specific fees, i.e. lab fees (typically around \$50 for Natural Science Lab)
 - Art courses, language course, science course



Requirements to Remain as a Dual Enrollment Student

To continue from semester to semester:

- Students must maintain a minimum cumulative UNG GPA of 2.5 at the end of each semester beginning with the second semester of enrollment.
- Students who earn less than a 2.0 in their first semester will lose eligibility for the program and may not continue.



UNG Dual Enrollment Student Expectations

- Appropriate studying, time management & conduct
- Spring Break (must follow UNG's academic and holiday calendars)
- Mandatory class attendance and importance of not being tardy (UNG Dual Enrollment absence policy)
- Minimum cumulative UNG GPA of 2.5
- All grades earned at UNG transfer back as letter grades and figure into high school GPA as calculated by the high school counselor
- High school IEP/504 and other plans do not automatically carry over without notification. Students with these plans are encouraged to seek assistance from UNG's Student Disability Services office.



Update from Dual Enrollment to Traditional Freshman

No need to reapply or pay application fee!!

Two Easy Steps

- 1. Complete an Admissions Intent Form for Dual Enrollment students no later than **June 1**st!
- 2. Send in a current high school transcript

Admission into the bachelor's degree program as a freshman is extremely competitive and not guaranteed if a student is dual enrolled and wishes to continue at UNG as a freshman.



The Dual Enrollment program provides eligible high school students the opportunity to take college courses to satisfy their high school graduation requirements while, at the same time, earn college credits



- Are required to return books after each semester
- Will receive letter grades which will be submitted to their high school

- 3. Pass the admissions test (ACCUPLACER) *or* submit official ACT or SAT scores or other acceptable readiness documents
- 4. Complete the Dual Enrollment funding application at https://www.gafutures.org/
- 5. Attend an orientation & registration session with a Dual Enrollment Coordinator

Most Common Questions

- Can colleges set an age requirement? Yes, up to individual college.
- How many terms can a student participate? Three per year, fall, spring, summer.
- ➤ If a student is full-time at the high school can they still take courses through DE? Yes, there is no limit to the total number of courses taken except 15 hours per college institution.
- ➤ Do they have to take EOC exams? With the exception of 9th Grade Literature and Composition, Algebra I or Coordinate Algebra, Analytic Geometry or Geometry, and Biology, students are now exempt from taking the Georgia Milestones End-of-Course assessment.
- Can they earn a full Carnegie unit of credit for only one semester of DE instruction? Yes, if the DE college course is a 3 or more hour college class.
- Are DE students guaranteed a parking space at LHS? No, Dual Enrollment does not guarantee them a parking space!

Most Common Questions

- Can students get duplicate credit for a DE course they have already earned credit for at the high school? Yes, but only as elective credit and this only applies to core courses.
- Can a student withdraw from a DE course? Yes, a student must FIRST contact the high school counselor before taking any WITHDRAWAL action. If the decision is reached to allow the student to withdraw or drop a course, then the student must return to the high school and be enrolled in the matched high school course corresponding to the college DE course. Failure to immediately enroll in the matched high school course may result in an "F" on the students transcript.
- ➤ What expenses are not covered by the DE program? Students may incur expenses for course related fees and supplies required for a particular course or optional fee charged by the postsecondary institution.
