

WHAT IS DUAL ENROLLMENT?

<u>Dual Enrollment</u> allows eligible high school students to take college courses and earn both high school college credit for the same course.

Dual Enrollment is a state mandated program and is governed by F.S. 1007.271 and the Florida Department of Education Office of Articulation

Advantages

- Earn credit toward college degree
- Less time to degree after high school
- ► Gives students an understanding of what college is like
- ► College graduation rates are higher for students who participated in dual enrollment
- ► Free college credit

Disadvantages

- Out of state or private schools may not accept the credit
- ► If the student is not successful it is part of his or her permanent record
- ► There is not as much time for extra-curricular activities

TYPES OF DUAL ENROLLMENT?

Regular Dual Enrollment

Students take up to three college classes per semester either at the college or on their high school campus.

Early Admission

High school seniors enroll in 12-15 credits at the college and do not take any classes at the high school (for public school students only).

TYPES OF DUAL ENROLLMENT?

Collegiate High School

There are two Collegiate high schools.

- Lake Howell High School Business Focus
- Crooms Academy Technology Focus

Public school students take classes at the high school, online, and at the college to complete their AA degree by the time they graduate from high school.

WHAT DEGREES ARE OFFERED?

ASSOCIATE OF ARTS DEGREE (A.A.) (Academic D.E.)

The General Education portion of a bachelor's degree. The degree consists of 36 credits of general education and 24 elective credits. Electives are used for University prerequisites.

ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE DEGREE (A.S.) (Career D.E.)

Courses are mostly in a specialization area (example: computers, business, criminal justice, etc.). Some General Education courses are included. Not designed for students to transfer to a university.

Certificate Programs (Career D.E.)

Usually one year and can be vocational or college credit.

Meant for students who want to get a skill and then get a job,

Some examples are Accounting Applications, Automotive repair, Digital Media, etc.

DO ALL DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENTS COMPLETE A DEGREE?

SOME STUDENTS TAKE A ONE CLASS, SOME TAKE A SEVERAL CLASSES, AND A FEW STUDENTS COMPLETE A WHOLE DEGREE WHILE DUAL ENROLLED.



WHEN CAN I DUAL ENROLL?

Fall – August

Spring-January

Summer – May (second 6 weeks begins in June)



Who Can Dual Enroll?

- Students in Public, Private or Home School
- Students in grades 6-12
- Must have completed one high school course
 - Can be completed in middle school
- 2.5 GPA for Career OR 3.0 GPA for Academic
 - No GPA required for Home School
- Qualifying SAT, ACT, or Post-Secondary Education Readiness Test (P.E.R.T.) test scores

If you attend a Private School you can only take classes with Seminole State if you are from a private school located in Seminole County that has an agreement with Seminole State College.

Continued Eligibility

- Maintain your high school GPA (3.0 or 2.5)
- Earn a 2.0 or higher Cumulative College GPA
- No classroom behavioral issues:

"Regardless of meeting student eligibility requirements for continued enrollment, a student may lose the opportunity to participate in a dual enrollment course if the student is disruptive to the learning process such that the progress of other students or the efficient administration of the course is hindered". F.S. 1007.271(3)

How can I Dual Enroll?

Public/Private School

- Have your high school counselor enter the GPA on the dual enrollment form and initial beside it.
- Complete the dual enrollment application.
- Bring the application to your closest Seminole State Campus. The student will be admitted and given a Seminole State College ID number.
- Create your MySeminoleState Account.

- If you have SAT/ACT test scores have them sent to Seminole State College.
- If you do not have test scores you will need to take the P.E.R.T. or remote Accuplacer
- Public school students will be given a link to order books.
- Private school students will complete the 869 form with the high school counselor.
- The registration form should be sent to dualenrollment@seminolestate.edu or brought to the nearest campus student service area to be processed. High school counselors will confirm class approvals before the student can register.

WHICH CLASSES CAN I TAKE?

Classes that are approved:

Those that are required for high school graduation

Those that are meeting AA/AS/Vocational requirements

Classes that are not approved:

- ▶ Developmental
- Courses that are only 1 credit (except engineering and Honors)
- ▶ Physical education
- ► Adult education

IMPACT ON EDUCATIONAL RECORD

- Courses are part of the student's permanent educational record. If a student is not successful in a course, it will not be removed from the college transcript.
- Courses are listed on both the high school transcript and college transcript.
- Courses are weighted on the high school transcript the same as IB or AP.
- Unsuccessful attempts at college classes could impact the students' eligibility for future financial aid.

DROP/WITHDRAW

<u>Drop:</u> Dropping a class means the class will NOT appear on your transcript; has to happen within the first week of classes

<u>Withdraw:</u> Withdrawing a class means you will receive a grade of "W" on your transcript; will not impact your GPA but can possibly impact your future financial aid.

Public/Private School Students: will need their counselors permission to drop or withdraw from a class




TEXTBOOKS

Public School Students: Textbooks will be provided by the school

Home School Students: Textbooks will be provided by the college.

Private School Students: Textbooks must be purchased by the parents.



TEST SCORES

P.E.R.T.

ACT

SAT

- Unofficial scores can be used for one term only
- Official scores MUST sent directly from the testing agency before registering for a second term

Academic Calendar

- ▶ Summer DE Registration begins April 6
- ▶ Fall DE Registration begins June 23
- ▶ Spring DE Registration begins November 3

- ► Classes begin May 10th (Summer)
- ► Classes begin August 24th (Fall)
- ► Classes begin January 11th (Spring)

Steps To Enroll

- ▶ 1. Student completes the Seminole State application and submit to school counselor
- ▶ 2. Counselor verifies high school GPA and signs the application.
- ▶ 3. Student or counselor then emails the application to dualenrollment@seminolestate.edu (students can also bring the form to any campus to be processed if approved by the counselor)
- ▶ 4. Seminole State receives the application and once processed the student is sent information on how to create a myseminolestate account and how to register for the remote Accuplacer placement test or PERT if needed.

- ➤ 5. If the student needs assistance after creating the myseminolestate account the student should call 407-708-2000 for password or username issues.
- ▶ 6. Testing information will be included in the package sent to the student after the application has been processed.
- ▶ 7. Seminole State dual enrollment department will assist students with picking classes if needed.

- Dual enrollment students cannot save their classes or register for classes online.
- ➤ Students or counselors should email the registration form to dualenrollment@seminolestate.edu (students can also bring the form to any campus to be processed once approved by the high school counselor)
- ▶ Dual enrollment students are eligible to take up to 3 classes per semester.
