Holiday greetings to our Spotted Owl families! We are excited to be welcoming Ms. Laura Chatmon, as our new teacher on Monday, 12/9. Please say hello or give her a wave when you see her smiling face in our hallways.

We continue to encourage our 4<sup>th</sup> graders to read while on Winter Break! Each quarter the goal for our students is to achieve at least 15 points with 80% comprehension or higher. Our Spotted Owl Citizen of the Month for November was Lourdes Marrero, from Ms. Rieke's class. She exemplifies the meaning of the word responsibility. Way to go, Lourdes!

The weather was perfect for our field trip to the Energy and Marine Center in Port Richey. Check out some photos of our field trip on the WGES Facebook page! Students commented on what a great time they had and how they would love to go back! Our 4<sup>th</sup> graders were able to experience a true estuary. They learned the importance of estuaries in a marine environment and how ecosystems support living things.

We would also like to remind you that 4<sup>th</sup> grade focuses heavily on writing. We have been concentrating on the writing characteristics of Focus, Organization, and Supporting Details, with adding personal experiences, and paying attention to capitalization, spelling, and grammar. With much hard work and positive effort, the students are showing growth with their writing skills every week! The Florida FCAT Writing Test will be February 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>.

During the test students will be presented with an Expository or Narrative writing prompt. They will be responsible to determine the focus of that prompt, develop a writing plan, and then complete a 4 or 5 paragraph essay all within a one hour time frame.

Cold and allergy season is here. If you can send a box of tissues to school, it would be greatly appreciated. We surely appreciate your efforts to support your children with academics at home. Our continued home and school connection will help the children experience success and academic growth, while developing a love of learning!

## **GREAT GREY OWLS**

The Great Greys are zooming right along in quarter two. We have been very busy and have no intention of slowing down because we have a lot to do before the winter break. So stay motivated and make sure you are showing effort at home as well as in class.

A great way to keep up with your AR goal is by reading at home each night. In science, the STEM Fair has officially begun and students should be working diligently on their projects. Teachers will be checking in with the students periodically to see if each step of the scientific method or engineering design process is completed on time; however, the project should be completed at home. We are amazed at what these young minds have come up with and are eager to see the results!

# **IMPORTANT CLINIC NOTICE:**



Children of any age may experience a clothing emergency at school. While we try to provide second-hand replacements in our clinic, our resources are limited and we do not

always have the right size to fit every child. Additionally, "borrowed" clothing does not always get returned to school once it has been laundered.

One way you can help us with this problem is to keep a set of clothes in your child's backpack for "emergencies" that may arise. This would limit the learning time lost waiting for a parent to bring something to wear from home. Also, if your child has recently borrowed some clinic clothes, please return them to school as soon as they have been laundered.
