

#IBInvolved: Water for South Sudan

Through the study of Linda Sue Park's dual-narrative, A Long Walk to Water, Sixth-graders are conducting an in-depth study of the political, social, and cultural climate of South Sudan. "A Long Walk to Water begins as two stories, told in alternating sections, about two eleven-year-olds in Sudan, a girl in 2008 and a boy in 1985. The girl, Nya, is fetching water from a pond that is two hours' walk from her home: she makes two trips to the pond every day. The boy, Salva, becomes one of the "lost boys" of Sudan, refugees who cover the African continent on foot as they search for their families and for a safe place to stay. Enduring every hardship from loneliness to attack by armed rebels to contact with killer lions and crocodiles, Salva is a survivor, and his story goes on to intersect with Nya's in an astonishing and moving way." While reading this dual-narrative, students will focus on Author's Craft as well as the ways in which Point-of-View and Setting change perspectives of fairness and developments in the world.

To make the text-to-life connection, PVMS will take part in the Water for South Sudan Iron Giraffe Challenge. Water for South Sudan is a not-for-profit organization founded by Salva Dut whose focus is "Drilling Wells, Transforming Lives." Last year, PVMS raised enough money to place third internationally in this challenge. As a reward for our efforts, Salva Dut personally SKYPED PVMS all the way from South Sudan.
