Eastbrook Local News: Primary Classes

We hope you and your family enjoyed your Thanksgiving holiday with family and friends. The children have been sharing stories of family gatherings and our sumptuous feasts. Before we went on holiday break we discussed what we might be eating during our Thanksgiving feast. Many children shared that they loved apple pie and stuffing but were not so fond of the turkey. Perhaps they may have felt some sympathy for our poor turkey friend? We hope the children shared with you the many songs and finger plays we have learned, i.e., 10 Little Indian Girls & Boys, and 4 Fat turkeys are we (we slept all night in the tree).

Through the month of December we will continue to work on fine motor skills, i.e., puzzles, playdough, manipulative counting and stringing beads, etc. For those students who will be transitioning to kindergarten next year we will be concentrating on handwriting activities especially on writing their names correctly by using only one initial cap followed by smaller case letters, for example: John (not JOHN). Please practice writing

your child's name correctly at home.

Since December continues with all the magical holiday joy, we hope to capture that joyfulness towards new learning. Mr. "J" plans on arriving right on time with his "jingle-jingle jacket" from Letter People Land. He is bringing his jingle bells for our own jingle bell parade. Mr. R will follow with many Reindeer tales especially the most famous of all - Rudolph! Mr. R has a fondness for rainbows and will be bringing his many colored scarves for his own Rainbow Parade!

We hope you enjoy sharing with your child all the joy and happiness this season brings as much as we do! We wish you and your family the warmest holiday wishes and will see you again when

school resumes on January 6, 2020.

(Please note that early release begins on December 17 and continues through December 19. The children will be dismissed by 1:00. There is no school on Friday, December 20st.)

December is an exciting time in Kindergarten. Our reading and language framework continue with rigor and differentiated instruction. We will focus on fiction/nonfiction, compare and contrast, story plot/ setting, and problem solution. As you review your child's classwork and journal entries, please praise your child for their reading and writing progress. Simple c-v-c (consonant-vowel-consonant) words are a great place to start.

In math, we will continue to learn about 2D (flat) and 3D (solid) shapes. You can help your child practice these skills by identifying shapes around the house or the store. Discuss how they can move (roll, stack, slide), how many sides and vertices they have, and how you can use the shapes to create other objects.

Our social studies unit will focus on Holidays Around the World. The kindergarten students will travel to other classrooms for this unit to learn about the diverse customs celebrated at this time of year.

Our month will conclude with a Holiday Party. More information to come and volunteers will be needed. You will need to be an approved Dividend to help out at the party as well.

The kindergarten team would like to wish everyone a wonderful Winter Break and a Happy New Year!

Happy December, First Grade Families! We hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving with your family and friends. We know the holiday excitement is starting to build so please maintain normal routines as much as possible in the weeks leading up to winter break. Children need predictability and consistency as we will continue to work hard in December. If you haven't done so, please be sure to send in the First Grade Activity Fee so that we may continue with the activities and fieldtrips as scheduled.

In Reading, we will identify the author's reasons for including information in a text. We will also connect information both within a text and across several texts. In Writing, we will finish up our informational compositions and learn to write explanatory texts.

In Math, we will understand more about place value in twodigit numbers. In Science, we will learn about our sky and stars which is always an exciting unit. We will discuss various holidays and festivals around the world in Social Studies. We will also review maps and a variety of landforms that make our Earth.

As you are making your December plans, please keep in mind that December 17th, 18th, and 19th are Early Release days with a 1:00 P.M. dismissal. December 20th is a teacher planning day and there is no school for students. Please have an enjoyable, restful holiday break and Happy New Year and as always, we thank you for your support!

We will have a short month in December due to our holiday break. We plan on having a Winter Celebration before we leave for break and will be looking for volunteers as well as donations to make the celebration a success. We will still have homework and encourage you to continue to support your child as they read, practice the sight words from the homework and work on math flashcards. We are comparing similar texts and continuing to look for evidence to answer the questions about what we have read. We are encouraging your student to look at the details. We will be working on adverbs in grammar, since we have already covered nouns, verbs and adjectives.

In math we are moving from shapes and attributes to bigger and better things as we start 3-digit addition and subtraction with a big focus on word problems.


In science we continue with Energy. We have enjoyed learning about the United States of America symbols, and Native Americans and Pilgrims in social studies.

Good readers get that way through practice. Set aside some time each day to read with your child, ask them questions and share a good book. You could also take this opportunity to practice good old-fashioned flash cards for math, or work on the site math-drills so that your child is fluent in that area as well. You will enjoy the time spent with each other.

Thank you for your continued support. If we work together, we can help your child become all that they can be.

Eastbrook Local News: Intermediate Classes

December is here and our 3rd graders have been working hard! In ELA, we've been reading several informational articles and reviewing text structure, main idea and details, and author's point of view. We will be diving into informational writing this month and focusing on analyzing writing prompts.



As we wrap up our multiplication and division unit in math, please make sure your child continues to practice their math facts at home throughout the school year, as knowing their facts fluently is the goal by the end of third grade. Understanding fractions is our next unit of focus. Students will be learning how to identify and represent, and compare fractions using various strategies.

In science we have been learning about types of energy and will be focusing on light energy! Students have also been learning about the U.S. regions and the purpose of government.

We would also like to take this opportunity to thank our Dividend Volunteers who accompanied the third grade on our trip to LEGOLAND last month. We couldn't have done it without you.

Reminder from our School Board Nurse

Seminole County Medication Policy requires that for any prescription or over the counter medication to be given at school to an elementary student, an authorization (form 157) must be filled out by the physician and signed by the parent. Medication is to be signed in to the clinic by the parent or designated adult and not sent with the child. Medication will not be signed in without a completed authorization.

State law does allow for certain emergency medications such as asthma inhalers and epi-pens to be carried and self-administered with the appropriate authorization from the physician and parent. Winter is here and we have been working very hard in 4th grade! In Language Arts, students have continued to learn about the writing process, and have now written both informational and opinion essays. We will continue to work on these skills over the next few weeks. Soon, we will begin working on non-fiction texts, discovering main idea and understanding the difference between firsthand and secondhand accounts.

In Social Studies, students are working on a big project that is going to answer the question "Why Did Spain Settle St. Augustine?" We are enjoying learning about Florida history as we prepare for our upcoming St. Augustine field trip in February!

In math classes, fourth graders have been learning strategies to generate equivalent fractions and compare fractions. They will now use those skills to add/subtract fractions and build line plots to interpret fractional data. Fluent multiplication helps with these concepts so continue to practice basic math facts using games or flashcards!

Our St. Augustine trip is rapidly approaching, and we have a bit of money left to raise before we will be able to go on this amazing adventure! Please make sure you get your permission slips and payments into your student's teacher before the December 19th due date. Also, there will be lots of information coming home regarding celebrations, half-days and more over the next few weeks so please be sure to check your child's binder regularly for upcoming events. Thank you for your continued support.

Fifth Grade has been working hard! In Reading students have been working on relationships in historical texts. Ruby Bridges has been the topic as the students have really dug into a variety of articles from different points of view. In addition, they have been learning about first and second hand accounts. In Writing they are focusing on the introductory paragraph and the 1st PEELEEL paragraph by following specific steps. Students are also practicing elaborating on the evidence.

In Math students have been working on multiplying and dividing decimals and using a variety of strategies when doing so. In Science the unit of force and motion has ended. The next unit's topic is space exploration and the solar system.

We finished up the Kid's Heart Challenge and we are excited about all the good things our families have done to help children and adults who are affected by heart disease. As a school we raised \$2851.06. Our top money earner was Rhys Bailey with \$270.78 and our top class was Ms. Roupe with \$615.78. Way to go Eastbrook!



We have also concluded our Magic Fit Challenge. Our students have been performing exercises that are provided by the Orlando Magic trainers. As a result, the Orlando Magic is providing one ticket to a game for each student. The tickets should come in soon and directions on how to use them will be included with the tickets.

Our Country Western Day is on December 6th. Hopefully your family will be able attend this wonderful annual event. Don't forget to bring your dancing shoes (or boots) with you. Also, our cross-country season has begun. We are excited about watching our runners do their personal best at each meet.

We will also look forward to seeing you and your family after the break. Until then have a happy and healthy holiday season.

In STEM we are finishing our fall challenges. Fifth graders are making a bridge from q-tips, pipe cleaners, and craft sticks to learn about structural efficiency. Fourth graders are learning how pulleys are used as a simple machine to move heavy objects. They are creating a pulley system to raise a pumpkin. Third graders are examining bat's wings, how they are similar and different to a human's arm. They will create a pair of bat's wings that are symmetrical. Second graders are busy working on a pumpkin stand to show how gravity pulls objects to the center of the Earth unless something holds it up. First graders used a budget of \$20 to buy materials to make a wagon that can haul 20 candy pumpkins. And finally, kindergarten will learn about scarecrows and how they help farmers.

Next month we will explore Native American homes. Each grade level will build a home from a specific region of North America. We will discuss how the homes from each region were built with the materials found in nature.


