Grade 7 Physical Exam Info

Starting in the 2017-2018 school year, all students entering 7th grade need to have a physical exam. THINGS TO KNOW: *The physical exam should be done within 12 months before the start of 7th grade by a doctor, nurse, or other healthcare professional. *Let the school know if you need more time because of rescheduling. *Form 14 should be filled out by the doctor's office and brought to school when you register your child for 7th grade. *Use the physical exam as a time for you and your child to ask the doctor or nurse questions about teen health and wellness issues.
