
## Changes for Fall 2020

Policy Changes

- Test coordinators will use their school's regularly scheduled UPS pickup to return materials. If UPS does not make regular pickups at your school, schedule a pickup with UPS using the prepaid label and information provided by College Board.
- A downloadable copy of the test directions is now available in SSD Online. The SSD coordinator can print these out for students approved for written copy of oral instructions (SSD code 041).
- You may see these accommodations referred to in new ways (how they're administered won't change):
  - a. 50% extended time may be referred to as "time and a half."
  - b. 100% extended time may be referred to as "double time."
  - **c.** Braille graphs and figures may be referred to as "raised line drawings."
  - d. Magnifiers and magnifying machines may be referred to as "non-electronic magnifying devices" and "electronic magnifying devices," respectively.

### **Testing Staff Roles**

- As you prepare for test day, be sure to identify and work closely with the following individuals:
  - Test Coordinator Responsible for all aspects of the test administration at the school
  - Backup Coordinator Responsible for coordinating the test administration if the test coordinator is not available
  - Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD)
     Coordinator(s) Responsible for requesting accommodations and working with the test coordinator to coordinate the SAT for students with disabilities
  - Proctor

    Responsible for conducting a secure, valid administration in the testing room
  - Room Monitor

     Responsible for assisting the proctor with activities and monitoring students in the testing room
  - Hall Monitor Responsible for monitoring the hallways on test day

### Staff Requirements

- Test Day staff cannot be involved with paid coaching or paid SAT preparation.
- Test Day staff cannot have taken the SAT within 180 days of the administration date.
- Any staff member, including the coordinator, who will have access
  to test books before test day must not have a child or member of
  their household taking the same College Board test in the same
  window at any test site.
- Test Day staff may serve multiple roles in a small test center. We recommend the Test Coordinator remain in the test room and have the additional test day staff serve the Hall Monitor.
- In large test centers, we recommend the Proctors be in the testing rooms, with appropriate number(s) of Room and Hall Monitors.
   The Test Coordinator then can float around the school, assisting with questions and resolving any issues that may arise.

### **Testing Staff Roles**

Tost Coordinator

- The **Test Coordinator** is responsible for:
  - All aspects of the School Day administration at a school, including:
    - · Planning rooms and staff for test day.
    - Receiving and securing all test materials, including test materials for students testing with accommodations.
    - Managing test site and staff, and supervising all activities related to testing, including accommodated testing.
    - Collecting, packing and returning test materials, completing test day forms and ordering makeup materials.
  - Acting as the main contact between the College Board and the school, receiving all communications from the College Board.
  - Identify at least one Proctor to serve as the back-up Test Coordinator

### **Testing Staff Roles**

SSD Coordinator


- The Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinator is responsible for:
  - Being the school's liaison with the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities office.
  - Submitting accommodation requests for all students who request them at his/her school.
  - Accessing and printing the Nonstandard Administration Report (NAR) and assisting the test coordinator in determining rooms and staff required for administering the test with accommodations.
  - Partnering with the test coordinator to reconcile accommodated testing materials and administer the SAT to students who are testing with accommodations.
  - Schools may have more than one SSD Coordinator, however one person will be identified as a primary SSD Coordinator who will receive communications from College Board.



### **Other Testing Dates**

- Winter PSAT/NMSQT: January 26, 2021
- Spring SAT Test Dates:
  - Primary Test Date: March 24, 2021
    - Accommodated Testing Window: March 24 April 6, 2021
  - Makeup Test Date: April 27, 2021
- Look out for the Spring 2021 Implementation Handbook for more details on spring testing.
- PSAT 10:
  - Delaware requires all districts to test 10th graders using the PSAT™ 10 in March 2021. Please order your materials in TOS.
- PSAT 8/9:
  - Districts have the option to test 9th graders using the PSAT™ 8/9 between February and March or April 2021.
  - Schools can determine which test date, within these test windows, best suits their school schedule. PSAT 8/9 is at the cost of the district.

# College Board Opportunity Scholarships

- College Board is committing \$25 million in scholarships over the next five years.
- College Board Opportunity Scholarships launched in December 2018.
- Half of the scholarships are designated for students whose families earn less than \$60,000 per year.
- Students earn chances at scholarships by completing 6 key actions along the path to college. Scholarships are awarded monthly through drawings among all eligible students.

## College Board Opportunity Scholarships


This is a unique scholarship program. These scholarships:

- · Don't require an application or essay




