

Place and label 12 items in Spanish on and around the table that are typically found on an altar. Your design should take up the entire page and have little empty background and empty space.	CREATE A MARKET STALL Design a market stall, a market cart, or a kiosk that is selling at least 12 of the items that people purchase for their homes. Label each item in Spanish. The presentation should take up the entire page and have little empty background and empty space.	CREATE A TOMB AT THE CEMETERY Design a tomb at the cemetery. Include a grave stone and decorate it with 12 items from the vocabulary list. Label each item in Spanish. The presentation should take up the entire page and have little empty background and empty space.

WRITING ACTIVITY

You have just spent the last three days in Oaxaca during the festival of "el día de los muertos." Write a journal entry that consists of 2 sections.

Section I

The first section should describe the **events** you experienced. Include items such as your visit to the *mercado*, a visit to the *panteón*, visiting someone's house, or other activities that you recall. Select any 7 of the **vocabulary** words and write about them. Include the Spanish word, what it means in English, and how it figures into the celebration. Include any **mythological information**, **symbolic meaning**, **and history** as appropriate. Support your statements with examples and cite any references.

Section II

Use the following poem as a basis for this section.

To the resident of New York, Paris or London
The word "death" is never pronounced because it burns the lips.
Mexicans on the other hand frequent it, caress it.
They sleep with it. They celebrate it. It is one of their favorite games and their most permanent love. - Octavio Paz

In your own words and based on the movie and your research, explain the message in Octavio Paz's poem. Support your explanations with examples from the text; cite any outside references.

Questions to ask yourself as you analyze / interpret the poem.

- What is the poet trying to say?
- How forcefully does he state his message?
- What imagery adjectives and verbs does he use?
- Are these adjectives and verbs typically applied to this subject?
- How do these adjectives and verbs stand out and contribute to the meaning?
- Which line(s) really brings out the meaning of the poem?
- What is the tone or mood of the poem?

• What comparisons / contrasts does he make?
