What is dual enrollment?

Georgia's Dual Enrollment program allows high school students to

earn college credit while satisfying graduation requirements and working on their high school diploma.

The Dual Enrollment program covers:

- tuition,
- mandatory fees,
- and required textbooks. (gaFutures)

Benefits

- Introduces students to college-level coursework.
- Earning college credits while still in high school may enable students to graduate early and/or possibly even earn an associate degree, diploma or certificate.
- Helps students adjust to certain aspects of the college experience (e.g., classes, coursework, and instruction, being on a college campus) so the transition from high school to college may be easier.
- Students who participate in a dual enrollment program are more likely to go to college and get a college degree.


Benefits Continued...

- Students may be able to take classes that are not offered at their high school, especially in subject areas they are interested in for a potential career.
- Participating in a dual enrollment program demonstrates a student's ability to handle more difficult coursework which is something college admissions officers may look upon favorably during admissions and recruiting.
- Taking college-level classes while still in high school may build confidence and encourage those students who may not be thinking about college to reconsider. (gaFutures)
- Save Money, Save Time

Who should participate?


- Students who are self-motivated and self-starters.
- Students in the program are independent and are responsible for attending class on their own. It is the student's responsibility to check in with counselors or advisors while participating in the program.
- Remember- students will be in courses with postsecondary students.

How it works... Part 1 (Student)



*Students are strongly encouraged to complete these steps on their own. It is our hope that completion of these tasks will mark their readiness to enter the program.

How it works... Part 2 (Parent-Student-Counselor)



- Student will be evaluated by the college to determine admissions decision.
- Email your counselor to set up a meeting time to discuss the program and course selection.
- Counselor will assist with filling out Student Participation Agreement from FCS.
- Student must log on to www.gafutures.org and complete the online Dual Enrollment Funding Application.
 Students are required to complete the online Dual Enrollment Funding Application each semester they participate.
- Student must set up a meeting with an advisor at the college to register for classes. The college advisor will be your point of contact at the college level.
- Each semester, students must submit the most up-to-date copy of their college schedule to their counselor. Student's high school schedule cannot be altered and funding cannot be approved without the college schedule.

What kind of classes can I take?

- 1 college class (3 credit hours)=1 high school credit
- Core
 - English 1101= Advanced Composition
 - POLS= American Government

How many DE classes can I take?

- limited to earning 30 credit hours through Dual Enrollment program
 - if you plan to continue your DE classes after 30-credit hours, you must pay for them (price varies by college)
- DE classes must fit in your 7-period school day
- you can take summer courses through dual enrollment program through summer going into 12th grade
- you cannot take dual enrollment classes after you graduate

Ask yourself...

- What grade do you plan to participate?
 - Most students participate as juniors or seniors due to maturity and transportation
- Do you plan to participate full-time or part-time?
 - You can still play sports if you are full-time
- What type of classes do you want to take?
- Can you advocate for yourself?
- Are you passing your high school courses?
- Are you comfortable researching and applying college on your own?

Things to consider...

- College Schedule (MWF, TH, Online)
- High School Schedule
- Differing HS and College calendars:
 - Fall Break, Spring Break, Midterms/Finals
- You are beginning your college GPA. Dual enrollment

courses start your college GPA and are factored into

your HS GPA.

Things school counselors cannot manage...

- Class times at the college
- Grading systems at the college
- Professor/student issues
- Attendance at the college
- Add/Drop/Withdraw Period



AP vs. Dual Enrollment

AP Course

- AP test determines credit given at college
- Coursework is consistent across the nation
- Cost associated with AP exams
- Higher level institutions prefer that students max out AP courses before taking dual enrollment

<u>Dual Enrollment</u>

- Grade in course determines credit given (Instant; most will transfer)
- Coursework varies by institution & teacher
- Tuition is free
- Dual enrollment courses will remain on college transcript (start your college GPA)










Dates and Deadlines

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual Enrollment at Georgia State

- Students are enrolled as Non-Degree seeking student type (no major is assigned)
- Students can take classes during the regular Fall, Spring, or Summer semesters
- Access to campus facilities, clubs & student life activities
 ~(Excluding Greek organizations)

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Cost

- Tuition is covered by Georgia Student Finance Commission (GFCS)
 - Courses must be selected from state approved list
 - Non-funded classes must be paid for at the time of registration
- Mandatory university fees are waived
- Textbooks are provided on loan, but must be returned in good condition.
- Student Responsibilities:
 - Course specific fees: (Ex: science or foreign language)
 - Transportation
 - · Parking and meals



Requirements & Considerations

- Must be a rising Junior or Senior in high school
- Must obtain approval from HS counselor & parent/guardian

- Atlanta: On campus only (1000-4000 level courses)
- Perimeter: Online or on campus (1000-2000 courses)

FAQs

- Does DHS add any rigor points to courses that I take at a college?
 - Students will receive 1.0 Quality Point to their GPA when taking any Dual Enrollment course.
- Can I still participate in school activities if I attend college full time?
 - Yes, you can still participate in all school activities. If you are an athlete, you must take a minimum of 5 college classes (2.5 credits per semester) to remain eligible to play.
- Will Dual Enrollment classes count against my HOPE hours?
 - Courses do not count against any maximum hourly caps for the HOPE scholarships or grants.
- Will my student be responsible for the End of Course (EOC) Exam?
 - As of November 2016, Dual Enrollment students are exempt from the following EOC's when taken in Dual Enrollment: American Literature, Physical Science, US History, and Economics.
- Can I participate in Dual Enrollment over the summer?
 - Yes, if a student enrolls in Dual Enrollment courses during the summer session, the course,
 grade, and credit will be posted on the high school transcript. There is no option to deny credit.
