

Glynn Academy Daily Agenda for Instruction

Date August 2020 – May 2021

Opening (I Do)	Standards Addressed	Students in Edgenuity cover the state mandated standards for their course, 9-12 ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Electives (CTAE & Academic Electives) in the Edgenuity curriculum. Each student works on different standards depending on where they are in the course.
	Communicate Learning Targets Related to Standard(s)	The learning objectives that will be covered in each lesson are clearly labeled in Edgenuity. Each student is asked what formula, concept, main idea or information do you need to use in order to successfully complete your Edgenuity assignment.
	Success Criteria	Students are able to complete each assignment with a 70% or better to make continuous progress in completing the course.
	Introduction/Connection: (5-10 MIN)	Students who are doing virtual learning or distance learning will start with an orientation in Edgenuity if it's the first time taking the class. If they have taken an Edgenuity course before, they will go straight into the activities provided by the program. If a student is taking an Edgenuity class in the classroom and are recovering this class, they will start with a pretest to determine knowledge of standard. If they score an 80 or higher, they will skip the lesson and move on to a new lesson. If they don't, the program will take them through a variety of activities, including an instructional video, to cover the lesson's objectives.
	Direct Instruction/High Yield Instructional Strategies to be Used	The Edgenuity program provides a direct instructional component for every lesson. Students start their lessons with an introductory skills lesson, which reviews the concepts that they will be covering. Depending on the course, Edgenuity may provide reading passages that the student must read. The introductory skills lesson is followed by other skills lesson(s) that cover the standards. The lessons provide various examples of the concepts it covers. Furthermore, there are embedded questions in every instructional component to check for comprehension. Students are required to take notes highlighting the most important concepts covered in each lesson.
Work Period (We Do,	Guided Practice	The Edgenuity program provides interactive instructions that covers the standards. Each instruction includes practice questions that checks for student mastery. In addition to the Edgenuity program, the teacher provides feedback regarding content covered; and may reteach content to student using source material outside Edgenuity as needed to reinforce understanding of the standard.
	Independent/Collaborative Practice/Differentiation	Student must complete an array of activities in each lesson. These include vocabulary terms, practice questions, essays, projects, etc. If student does not master his assignments, he may be required to do it over. The teacher will provide feedback regarding the submitted assignments and work with the student to address any difficulties the student may be experiencing in completing the task assigned.

Formative/Summative Assessments (We Check)	Assessment Uses/Strategies	After each lesson, the student must complete a quiz assessment. Remediation is provided if the student does not successfully complete the assessment. This may include reteaching of standard, assigning supplemental material, etc. The student is given as many opportunities to retake quizzes until he has successfully completed said assessment. Remediation is provided after each unsuccessful attempt. Students are also required to complete Topic tests that cover many lessons. A final comprehensive exam is given once the course work is successfully completed.
Closing (We Check)	Summarize/Share: (5Min)	In the classroom, the teacher will review notes taken before an assessment is released. At this point, the teacher may ask questions to determine comprehension of material. If teacher determines that further reinforcement or redelivery of material is needed, the teacher will work with the student to achieve mastery of standard. If the student is working virtually, the student is expected to have notes and to have completed all activities.
Additional	Homework/Assignment/Attachments	Embedded within the Edgenuity program.
Instructional	Literacy (Reading and Writing)	The Edgenuity program contains reading and writing components in in every subject, that requires students to read, write, and think critically. Students are expected to answer their writing components and to follow proper grammar and writing norms that demonstrate an understanding of vocabulary and key concepts within each standard.
