Other Programs Available from Reaping Nature:

ADOPT OR BUY A WORM COMPOST BIN

- Bring nature into a classroom, work environment, or home with a Reaping Nature Red Wiggler Worm Compost Bin.
- A worm compost bin is an engaging and fun learning experience. These little wiggle critters will take your organic food scraps and turn them into a nutrient filled material for your plants or garden ("Black Gold").
- Worm composting is also known as "vermiculture," and it produces worm castings. To kids - that's "worm poop."
- 35 million tons of food waste reaches landfills each year in the United States. Learn how these wiggly creatures can help to reduce landfill food waste.
- Bins are available to schools to adopt for a few weeks, months, or an entire school year. Adoption fee of \$50 per bin applies and includes resources and a brief discussion with students.
- Schools, homes and places of work can buy a worm bin for \$75. Purchase price includes a small, plastic bin, resources, and one pound of red wigglers.
