GENERAL INFORMATION

- Teachers have made core academic recommendations. In addition to these academic recommendations, all rising 9th grade students are required to take Health and Personal Fitness.
- At all times, students must verify course selections and make additional elective choices.
- Should you disagree with the teacher recommendation(s) seen in Infinite Campus, please complete the online course waiver found on the EFHS website.
- Courses that end in "Y" are year-long courses. Courses that end in "S" are semester courses. Therefore, students who select a semester course must select two "S" courses to balance their schedule.
- Courses with a teacher name, instead of a course number, require that teacher's approval for placement/application/audit. See the teacher and/or check on the 2021-2022 Registration link on the EFHS Website for a copy of the application.
- Select the number of elective courses to equal a 7-period day schedule. In portal you will see 7070 when you have a complete schedule. You must select three alternates.
- Course descriptions for all high school courses are found in the Forsyth County Schools website in the 21-22 Course Digest.
- Information for application-based courses will be available on the EFHS website. These applications are due on February 24th at 4:00PM.
- If an elective course requires an audition, please contact the teacher for that pathway.

This registration period is for the sole purpose of selecting courses for the 2021-2022 school year. Students will be provided the opportunity to select their educational setting (face to face or virtual) at a later date.




