Course Description

This year we will utilize various genres of text in order to expose our students to ensure that our students have meaningful learning experiences. Upon completion of this course, students will be able to communicate effectively at or above grade level though reading, writing, speaking, and listening.

Course Objectives

At the end of the seventh grade year students are expected to have mastered the following skills and content:

- Read and annotate both fiction and nonfiction text;
- Cite evidence that strongly supports the topic or prompt;
- Write a constructed response on an assigned topic using and citing evidence from an assigned text;
- Write an extended response on an assigned topic citing evidence from text provided;
- Compare and contrast text both fiction and nonfiction that are centered on a common theme or topic;
- Write using the standard English conventions of grammar, spelling and syntax;
- Conduct research on an assigned topic and provide valid sources to support ideas.

It is our desire that all students enter the classroom attentive and eager to learn. However, this goal can only be accomplished if the classroom is orderly and structured. Students are expected to be active participants in creating a wonderful classroom environment where all students are able to learn.

Tests:

- Each unit, students will have a pretest. It is imperative that the students try their best on the pretest because it drives their personalized instruction for the remainder of the semester.
- DMS will have biweekly assessments. These formative assessments will cover standards that have been addressed in class during those two weeks.
- We will also have unit exams that will cover standards covered in a single unit. The biweekly assessments will help the teacher in driving instruction for students to score well on the culminating exams.

Projects:

• Projects may include writing assignments, research, oral presentations, and discovery projects. Project frequency will vary during each grading period depending on the material being covered.

Grading Scales

Students will receive at least one grade per week in each content area that will be available for viewing in Infinite Campus.
