The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) states the following (based on research):

"A missed school day is a lost opportunity for students to learn."

"Poor attendance has serious implications for later outcomes as well. High school dropouts have been found to exhibit a history of negative behaviors, including high levels of absenteeism throughout their childhood, at higher rates than high school graduates."

"Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. This relationship between attendance and achievement may appear early in a child's school career. A recent study looking at young children found that absenteeism in kindergarten was associated with negative first grade outcomes such as greater absenteeism in subsequent years and lower achievement in reading, math, and general knowledge."

• Flashcards can be made easily for addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. Write the problem on one side and the answer on the back side! Make it game!

Test your child verbally:

 When cooking or sitting with your child, test him/her on math facts. Let them win a treat when they get a certain amount correct!

2. <u>Read with your child</u>:

- You can read aloud to him/her, listen to your child read aloud, or even take turns reading. The more your child reads, the better his/her fluency will be!
- 3. <u>Test your child verbally</u>.
 - When your child reaches the end of a page or chapter, ask him/her questions about what he/she just read. This will help with comprehension!
