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Course Overview

In alignment with the Common Core Georgia Performance Standards (CCGPS), students will learn to develop their reading, writing, listening, viewing, and speaking skills by way of various texts and strategies. Students will also review English grammar, improve essay form and writing skills, and increase their vocabulary usage. My goal is not only to help students develop their understanding of the content covered over the course of the year, but also to foster an enjoyment for Language Arts. It is therefore essential that students maintain a healthy, conducive attitude towards learning and become positive and willing contributors to the class. Let's make this a great year!

- Standardized English and its writing conventions through Daily Grammar Practice (DGP)
- Writers' Workshops to facilitate our use of Academic English
- **Public Speaking Activities** including in-class discussions and debates to facilitate classroom learning as well as **Declamation** (memorized speech) twice per year
- **Vocabulary** Studies pertinent to all of the above

Homework is graded for completion as well as accuracy. All homework is due at the beginning of the class and should be a reflection of a student's best effort. It is therefore encouraged that students take the necessary time to prepare at home in order for homework to be most beneficial.

Late Work

The Henry County late work policy will be adhered to. Please note that assignments will not be accepted beyond the conclusion of each unit.

Make-up Work

After an absence, it is the student's responsibility to keep up with all assignments missed. Students should arrange to make up missed work upon returning from an absence. If a student is in class and refuses to complete an activity/assignment to demonstrate mastery, the activity/assignment will result in a grade of a zero.
