- **All students enrolled in a State EOC course must sit for the EOC Assessment.**

# Algebra 1

## <sup>1</sup>Algebra Requirements for 2011-12 and 2012-13 Cohorts.

Passing the Algebra 1 EOC is not a graduation requirement for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 cohort students. However, students cannot graduate without earning Algebra 1 credit, which can only be obtained by passing the Algebra 1 EOC for these students.

- Any student enrolled in high school on or after the 11-12 school year must **PASS** the Algebra EOC to receive a Standard High School Diploma (**Exception:** Middle grade students that took Algebra 1 during the **2010-2011** school year are not required to pass the Algebra EOC but it did count for 30% of the final course grade)
- Middle grades students enrolled in high school Algebra 1 must take and pass the Alg EOC to earn high school credit and to qualify for a standard high school diploma
- **Credit Acceleration Program (CAP):** Students can earn Algebra 1 course credit without enrolling in or completing the course by successfully passing the EOC.
- **All students enrolled in Algebra 1 must sit for the Algebra 1 EOC Assessment.**



# Biology 1

- Both middle grade and high school students must **PASS** the Biology 1 EOC to receive the Standard High School Diploma with **Scholar Designation**.
- As of the 2012-13 School year, middle grade students enrolled in high school Biology I must take the Biology EOC, and the results will count for 30% of the final course grade. Students must pass the course but are not required to pass the EOC to earn high school credit.
- **Credit Acceleration Program (CAP):** Students can earn Biology 1 course credit without enrolling in or completing the course by successfully passing the EOC.
- **All students enrolled in Biology 1 must sit for the Biology 1 EOC Assessment.**

# Geometry

- Both middle grade and high school students **are not required to pass** the Geometry EOC to receive the Standard High School Diploma with **Scholar Designation**.
- As of the 2012-13 School year, middle grade students enrolled in high school Geometry must take the Geometry EOC, and the results will count for 30% of the final course grade. Students must pass the course but are not required to pass the EOC to earn high school credit.
- **Credit Acceleration Program (CAP)**: Students can earn Geometry course credit without enrolling in or completing the course by successfully passing the EOC.
- **All students enrolled in Geometry must sit for the Geometry EOC Assessment.**

# U.S. History

- High school students must **PASS** the US History EOC to receive the Standard High School Diploma with **Scholar Designation**.
- Students must pass the course but are not required to pass the US History EOC to earn high school credit.
- **Credit Acceleration Program (CAP)**: Students can earn US History course credit without enrolling in or completing the course by successfully passing the EOC.
- **All students enrolled in US History must sit for the US History EOC Assessment.**

# Civics
