



SEMINOLE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS HIGH SCHOOL ATTENDANCE POLICY

PHILOSOPHY

High school teachers and administrators of Seminole County Public Schools recognize that regular attendance provides students with the opportunities necessary to meet course goals and objectives. Many integral activities, including class discussions, laboratory experiments, field trips, and guest speakers, cannot be simulated or replicated with bookwork! Therefore, with the goal of promoting student success, Seminole County Public Schools has adopted a uniform High School Attendance Policy. It is our intent to encourage honest, accurate, and consistent adherence to this policy by all of our student, parents, teachers, and administrators.

I. COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT

- A. Pursuant to 1003.21, F.S., a high school student enrolled in Seminole County Public Schools who is under the age of sixteen (16) is required to attend school regularly.
- B. A student who attains the age of sixteen (16) years during the school year is subject to the compulsory school attendance beyond the date upon which he or she attains that age unless the student files a formal declaration of intent to terminate school enrollment with the school. The formal declaration must meet the requirements of 1003.21(3), F.S.

II. CLASS ATTENDANCE DEFINED

- A. For purpose of this policy, class attendance is defined as the student being present and in class for ninety percent (90%) of an assigned class period.
- B. The teacher shall maintain the official record of attendance by class period of instruction.

III. EXCUSED ABSENCES

- A. The principle of the school has the authority to grant permission for a student to be absent from school.
- B. The parent, as defined by Florida Statutes, is required to provide to the schools attendance office documentation justifying their child's absence(s) from school whenever such an absence occurs.
 - After an absence, immediately upon return to school but no later than five (5) school days following an
 absence, parents must provide the school with documentation indicating that one of the following has
 occurred.
 - a. Medical treatment by a license physician;
 - Observance of a religious holiday;
 - Law enforcement order or court subpoena requiring the student's attendance;
 - d. Death of a family member;
 - e. Natural disaster;
 - f. Other circumstances approved by the principal.
 - Should the principal or person I charge of school reasonably suspect an abuse of any of the above
 provisions, he/she may require additional documentation as a condition for declaring the student's
 absence excused.
- C. A student will be considered to be in attendance when participating in an approved School activity or when, with the principal permission, he/she is attending to School-related business.

IV. UNEXCUSED ABSENCES

A. Absence from class for any reason other than those enumerated in section III.B.1. will be considered unexcused.

B. Notification will be provided to the parent regarding each absence via the school phone notification system or email. Written notification will be provided to the parent via U.S. mail upon the 5th and 10th unexcused absence per semester.

V. Guidelines for Make-up Work

- A. A student who is absent is required to make up all coursework missed, regardless of whether the absence is excused or unexcused. It is the student's responsibility to Obtain assignments upon returning to class immediately following an absence.
 - B. The student shall have the number of days they were absent, plus (1) additional day to complete and hand in make-up work for credit. Specific arrangements, which will be final, must be made with the student's teacher(s).
 - C. Unless exempted from this requirement by the principal or principal's designee, assignments given by the teacher at least one (1) week (five school days) in advance of a student's absence will be due by the assignment date. An assignment turned in by the due date will be graded by the teacher. When the quantitative/qualitative grade has been determined by the teacher, it will be reduced by one letter grade for every day the assignment was turned in late.

VI. High School Credit

- A. One (1) full credit for high school graduation is defined as two semesters of seventy-five (75) hours each of instruction (with the exception of summer school) in a designated course which contains student performance standards or high school credit for Dual Enrollment courses based on DOE equivalent chart.
- B. Students must be enrolled and in attendance for a minimum of ninety percent (90%) of the days per semester to receive credit. Excused absences, as determined by the District School Board policy and carried out by the secondary school principal, shall not be counted against minimum requirement.
- C. Any student who has been enrolled but not in attendance for instruction for a minimum of ninety (90%) of the class meeting days may not be awarded credit unless the student has demonstrated mastery of the student performance standards in the course of study by doing all of the following:
 - All make-up work must have been satisfactorily completed (section V).
 - If and when missed work is made up, the student qualifies to take a comprehensive final exam at the end of the course.
 - 3. The student must have a passing average to qualify to take the comprehensive exam.
 - 4. The student must pass the comprehensive exam.
 - If required, make-up time or attendance contracts must be completed. The comprehensive final examination may not necessarily be the same final examination as that given to the class as a whole.

VII. Attendance Requirement for Driving Privilege

- A. Pursuant to 1003.21(3), F.S., any student between fourteen (14) and eighteen (18) years of age who accumulates fifteen (15) unexcused absences in any (90) calendar day period is ineligible to obtain or retain driving privileges unless that minor:
 - Is enrolled in public school, nonpublic school, or home education program and satisfies relevant attendance requirements;
 - Has received a high school diploma, high school equivalency diploma, special diploma, or certificate of high school completion;
 - Is enrolled in a study course in preparation for test of General Education Development and meets relevant attendance requirements;
 - 4. Is enrolled in other educational activities approved by School Board and satisfies relevant attendance requirements;
 - 5. Has been issued a certificate of exemption according to 1003.24(3), F.S.; or
 - 6. Has received a hardship waiver, pursuant to 322,091, F.S.
- B. The school principal or his/her designee shall provide to The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles the name, sex, date of birth and social security number of each minor student who has accumulated fifteen (15) unexcused absences in a period of ninety (90) days unless the student meets the criteria set forth in Vt.A.

SEMINOLE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS STUDENT APPEARANCE AND DRESS CODE

Responsibility for the dress and appearance of students enrolled in the Seminole County Public Schools primarily rests with parents and the students. Some student apparel, however, may not be appropriate to wear to school even though that same apparel may be appropriate to wear in other settings. To assist parents and students in making appropriate fashion and grooming decisions for school, the School Board has established the following minimal guidelines for the appearance and dress of students.

The standards of appearance for students shall insure that the students be clean, neat, and properly dressed. They shall observe modes of dress and standards of personal grooming which are appropriate for the academic environment.

It is the responsibility of the principal to see that the dress appearance of any student shall not be extreme, to the point of creating a disturbance, or is hazardous to self, others, or school property, whether or not the specific case is covered by the information below. The principal or principal's designee has the final authority for interpreting whether a student's appearel/appearance conforms to the dress code.

(1) Head - No hats, caps, visors, hoods, sunglasses or other head gear may be worn on campus except with administrative permission (i.e. medical necessity, religious, school related events).

(2) Upper Garments

- (a) Garments must be of a length and fit that are suitable to the build and stature of the student.
- (b) All garments must have a collar <u>or</u> sleeves. Therefore, the following items are prohibited: halter tops, tube tops, backless dresses/tops, spaghetti straps, and tank tops.
- (c) Necklines of all upper garments must be modest. Low cut necklines are prohibited, and the cut of garments must not expose undergarments or cleavage.
- (d) Shirts must touch, at a minimum the top portion of lower garments at all times.
- (e) Garments that are distracting or inappropriate are prohibited, including but not limited to those with seethrough materials, skin-tight items, pajamas, trench coats, bandanas, rips/tears, printed profanity, or language/symbols/styles that promote the use of alcohol, drugs, tobacco products, gang-related or other illegal activities.

(3) Lower Garments

- (a) Pants and shorts should conform to the build and stature of the student.
- (b) Undergarments and the buttocks MUST remain entirely covered even while seated.
- (c) Dresses, skirts and shorts must be at least mid-thigh or below in length. Rip/tears above mid-thigh are not permitted.
- (d) The waistband of pants, shorts or skirts must be worn and secured between the hips and the waist.
- (e) Undergarments as outerwear, pajama pants, bathing suits, cheer shorts, bike shorts and Spandex material bottoms are prohibited.

(4) Footwear

- (a) All students shall wear shoes/footwear. Students must wear shoes that are safe and appropriate for the learning environment. Students must wear athletic shoes in all PE classes. Wheels are not permitted to be worn on campus.
- (b) Cleats, slippers and shoes with wheels are not permitted to be worn on campus. Cleats may be worn for appropriate extracurricular sports in proper areas.

(5) Accessories

- (a) Clothing, jewelry, and accessories shall not convey messages that are: crude, vulgar/profane, violent/death-oriented, gang related, sexually suggestive, promote alcohol, drugs or tobacco.
- (b) Jewelry or accessories that pose a safety concern for the student or others are prohibited. Dog collars, wallet chains, large hair picks or chains that connect one part of the body to another are prohibited.




eCampus Parent Access Information

eCampus is the platform for online and blended learning in Seminole County. As a parent, you may wish to observe what is happening in your child's classes. In this role, you can view course content and receive notifications. Follow the steps below to set up your "Observer" role for all your child's SCPS classes that are in eCampus. You will need your child's student ID number and login password to register. *Note, not all classes will have an eCampus course.

- 1. Go to SCPS homepage: www.scps.k12.fl.us
- 2. Click on the "Parents" tab toward the top of the page:



3. Scroll down and click "Electronic School Resources" on the left side of the page:



- 4. Click on: "eCampus Parent Access".
- 5. Examine the second paragraph and follow instructions to create a "Pairing Code".
- 6. Scroll down to the "Sign Up for eCampus" paragraph and click the first/top link to register:



- 7. Click "Parents sign up here".
- 8. Enter the appropriate information. Your child's username is his/her student ID. Your child's password is the password they use to log on to eCampus. The default password is your child's birthdate in the YYYYMMDD format, but your child may have changed their password.
- 9. You will receive a confirmation email at the email address you provided.
- 10. You are now logged on and able to participate in your child's class. However, you must click the link in your confirmation email to complete registration and log back on.
- 11. Click the link in your confirmation email.
- 12. Create a password and complete the registration process.
- 13. Upon completion of registration, you will always click the second link under the "Sign Up for eCampus" paragraph to log on to eCampus.






