Homework Assignments

Students will have no more than 4 homework assignments each week.

Students will be assigned one to three EdPuzzles (videos with embedded questions) throughout the week and a study guide. The study guides will be posted a week in advance and are due the day before the test (usually Thursdays @11:59pm) & the EdPuzzles will be due throughout the week. All assignments must be turned in via Google Classroom. Instructions on how to turn in assignments can be found under general information on Google Classroom.

Assessments

Students will have two exams each week, a vocabulary quiz, and a unit test. Vocabulary quizzes will take place on Thursdays and unit tests will take place on Fridays. Students will be able to retake exams if they make below a C, but they will only be able to make up to a 75%.

Attendance

This class is fast-paced and will cover a lot of information. It is imperative that students show up to class on the scheduled days and times. Attendance is necessary to pass this class. If a student is absent, they are responsible for completing their missed work. For each **excused** absence they will have one extra day to turn in their missing assignments. All work will be posted on Google Classroom.

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Materials

The only materials needed for this class are your student's school issued Chromebook and writing utensils, but it is recommended that your student has flashcards, a composition notebook, and highlighters to organize notes and to study efficiently.

Late Work Policy

Assignments: Assignments should be submitted on time, but in the case of a missed assignment deadline, students will have up to three days to complete an assignment (including weekends). If it is one day late you will receive a 90%, two days late a 80%, and three days late a 70%. No late work will be accepted after three days. Two remediation assignments will be given throughout the semester, these remediation assignments will only replace missing and failing study guide grades. All work late work must be turned in via the late work Google Form located under general information on Google Classroom. If there is an extenuating circumstance that makes it difficult or impossible to complete an assignment, students should contact me before or during the three-day late work window.

<u>Exams:</u> If students miss a test or quiz, they must set up an appointment with me to make up the assessment. They will have three days to be able to earn full credit on the exam. After this three-day period, students can only make up to a 75%.

Electronic Devices

<u>Chromebooks:</u> Students will use Chromebooks for research projects, independent work, and assessments. They will need to bring their fully charged Chromebook every day. Student should only have their chrome books out when we are doing online work. If your student lost their charger, go to www.myschoolbucks.com and order a new one.

<u>Cell Phones:</u> Students are expected to put away their phones in class. Phones are a distraction and in order to succeed in school students must be fully present. Students are required to put up their phones in a phone caddy on exam days, but if cellphone use become a reoccurring issue students will have to put them up every day, not just on exam days. It is also expected that students do not use/text on their apple/android watches during class.

<u>Earphones</u>: When the bell rings, students may not have earphones in their ears. They must be put away immediately. Similar to cell phones, earphones are a distraction and hinder students' ability to be fully engage in class.

Cheating

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If I catch a student cheating, they will get a phone call home, a zero for the assignment/exam and they cannot redo/retake their assignment/exam.

What counts as cheating:

- Plagiarism: Plagiarism is the use of someone else's work without their permission, or citation.
- Looking up answers during a test or quiz
- Having the exact same answers as another student

Curriculum
