- 5. Explain how Clarisse upsets Montag.
- 6. If Clarisse reflects what Montag feels, what must Montag be feeling? Is he happy at the beginning of the novel?
- 7. Discuss what Montag compares his happiness to.
- 8. Is Montag's wife a happy woman?
- 9. Explain how Montag's wife is saved. Discuss the attitude of the people who save her.

- 1. Discuss the attitude Montag's wife takes the day after her suicide attempt.
- 2. Explain the ways in which Clarisse's family is different from other families.
- 3. Is Montag in love with Clarisse?
- 4. Explain why it is important that the mechanical hound rouses itself at Montag.
- 5. Discuss how the children in Montag's society behave and treat each other? Why are they so violent?

Pages 32-50

- 1. Explain how firemen are chosen.
- 2. Explain the lies that Montag has been told about firemen and why he would be told such things.
- 3. Discuss why someone might turn in a neighbor for having books.
- 4. Discuss how the woman acts when they come for her books. Explain why this burning is different and upsetting to Montag and the firemen.
