What will my student learn?

Art

Students will:

- Engage in the creative process to communicate meaning.
- Create works of art based on selected themes.
- Understand and apply techniques and processes of two-dimensional art.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the safe and appropriate use of materials, tools, and equipment.
- Participate in appropriate exhibition(s) of works of art to develop identity of self as artist.
- Discuss personal works of art and the artwork of others.
- Investigate and discover the personal relationships of artists to the world through making and studying art.

Music

Students will:

- Evaluate music and music performances.
- Move to varied repertoire of music, alone and with others.
- Develop criteria for evaluation of music and music performances with teacher guidance.
- Use formal and informal criteria to evaluate music and musical performances.
- Refine music performances by applying personal, peer, and teacher feedback.
- Share musical work with classmates.
- Respond to contrast and events in music through space and place.
- Perform movements that are choreographed and non-choreographed.
- Perform simple melodic patterns, including pentatonic patterns.

Health/PE

Students will:

- Demonstrate competency in a variety of motor skills and movement patterns.
- Apply the knowledge of concepts, principles, strategies, and tactics related to movement and performance.
- Demonstrate knowledge and skills to help achieve and maintain a health-enhancing level of physical activity and fitness.
- Exhibit responsible personal and social behavior that respects self and others in physical activity settings.
- Recognize the value of physical activity for health, enjoyment, challenge, self-expression, and/or social interaction.
