Anthony, Frederick Douglass, Elizabeth Cady Stanton, Sojourner Truth and Harriet Tubman.  Define abolitionist and suffrage to examine the main ideas of the abolitionist and suffrage movements.  Identify Uncle Tom's Cabin and John Brown's raid on Harper's Ferry and explain how it relates to the Civil War.  Discuss how the issues of states' rights and slavery increased tension between the North and South during the Civil War.  Identify major battles, campaigns, and events during the Civil War (Fort Sumter, Gettysburg, Atlanta Campaign, Sherman's March to the Sea, Appomattox Court House).  Describe the role of Abraham Lincoln, Robert E. Lee, Ulysses S Grant, Jefferson Davis, Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson, and William T. Sherman during the Civil War.
