

Attention Parents!

Parents, please ask your students about the Frank L. Stanton 3rd-5th Grade weekly Lexile score challenge...Do you know your child's Lexile score? The Lexile® Framework for Reading is an approach to reading and text measurement. There are two Lexile® measures: the **Lexile reader measure** and the **Lexile text measure**. A Lexile reader measure represents a person's ability on the Lexile scale. A Lexile text measure represents a text's level on the Lexile scale. When used together, they can help a reader choose a book or other reading material that is at an appropriate level.

The Lexile reader measure can also be used as a Lexile text measure, like a Lexile reader measure, is reported on the same Lexile scale, from a low of BR (beginning reader) to a high of 2000L. The lower a book's Lexile measure, the easier it will be to comprehend. For example, a text with a Lexile measure or 850L will most likely be easier for a reader to comprehend than a text at 950L.

Parents, please review the books for your child's Lexile score for content and encourage him or her to read every day!

Dear First Grade Family,

The First Graders are really in love with learning! The month of February is a really busy month.

In Reading/ELA, we have been working on skills such as making inferences, comparing and contrasting stories and characters within those stories and finding the main idea of a story. During a story, have your child infer what will happen next using story clues before they continue reading. After reading a story, have your child retell the important events in the story from beginning to end.

In Math, we are beginning our unit on place value in order to add two digit numbers. Have your child to show their thinking using place value models (Tens and ones).

In Science, we will be studying weather and seasons. Ask your child how different seasons affect the way that their dress and their daily life

In Social Studies, we have been about inventors and historical figures. We will continue our learning of historical figures with Harriet Tubman.

We are encouraging students to log on to the following websites: IXL, Xtra Math, and Moby Max. Usage of these websites should occur daily, especially on weekends and student holidays.

The Georgia Milestones Assessment is set for **April**. Almost half of the Georgia Milestones Assessment will consist of constructed response questions - specifically in the areas of ELA and Math. Students have been taught to use the R.A.C.E. strategy when answering constructed response questions, and the CUBE method when solving math problems. Students are familiar with these acronyms and strategies. Please discuss with your child what each acronym means.
