We will be accepting Kindergarten applications for the school year 2023-2024 starting February 1st. Children must be 5 years old by July 31st. Stop by the Office for an application packet. Please return the completed application with your child's birth certificate, proof of residence, health record, and TB clearance.

PRESCHOOL REGISTRATION

We will be accepting Pre-Kindergarten applications for the school year 2023-2024 starting March 1st. Children must be 4 years old by July 31st, and meet priority categories that include family income, English learner, Individuals with Disabilities Act, foster care, or homeless. Pick up an application packet in the Office. You will need to return your application with a birth certificate, previous year's tax return, a self-addressed stamped envelope, and proof of residence. Please note space is limited and we recommend that families submit the completed application and all required documents as soon as possible, as applications are processed on a first come first serve basis. Once approved for enrollment, you will then need to turn in a health record and TB clearance.
