On January 23, 2021 HCS recognized the SHS PBIS team with a Connectedness Award for building Climate, Culture, and Community.



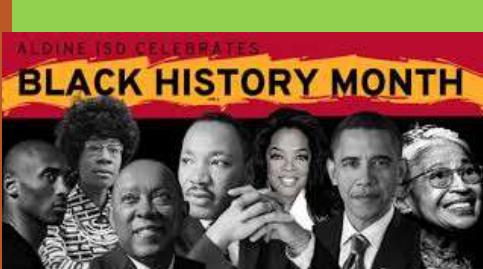

TIPS

5 ways to help STUDENTS with ORGANIZATION

- **Dedicate one homework space.** To boost organization and productivity, encourage parents to establish one (and only one!) quiet, uncluttered homework space for their child.
- **Establish consistent schedules and routines.** Setting a regular, faithfully followed schedule is one of the best ways to help students get things done consistently and efficiently.
- **Try checklists and inspections.** Develop a daily school-to-home checklist of materials that need to make it into the backpack so parents can review it with their child before and after school.
- **Use structured assignment books.** Give students explicit instructions on what to write down in the assignment book. Initial the book every day at school and have parents initial it at home.
- **Supervise organization at school and home.** Provide "surrogate frontal lobe support" in the form of direct, individualized supervision and reminders to help students make their system work.
