MATH

After the break, we will be working with shapes. MGSE2.G.1 Recognize and draw shapes having specified attributes, such as a given number of angles or a given number of equal faces. Identify triangles, quadrilaterals, pentagons, hexagons, and cubes. We will also be working on reviewing graphs. MGSE2.MD.10 Draw a picture graph and a bar graph (with single-unit scale) to represent a data set with up to four categories. Solve simple put-together, take-apart, and compare problems using information presented in a bar graph.

Reading, Vocabulary, Phonics, & Spelling

Our reading focus when we return from the break is still text features and text organization.

Our vocabulary focus next week will be inflections -s and -es.

Our phonics skill will be vowel pattern oo.

Spelling words for next week are: root, crew, spoon, bloom, grew, room, you, stew, boost, scoop, flew, threw, crook, shook, stood, cook-book, schoolbook, jewel.

Students should be using the correct spelling of these words in their writing!

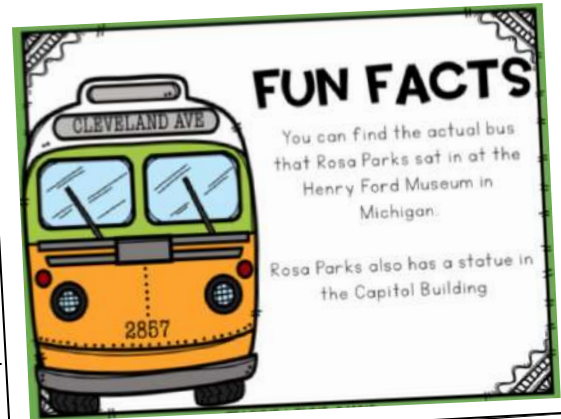
Social Studies
