TESTING BRIEF

Spring 2006 Georgia High School Graduation Tests in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science March 20-31, 2006

Georgia law (O.C.G.A. §20-2-281 G, (a) mandates that a "curriculum-based assessment be administered in grade 11 for graduation purposes" and (c) "that the State Board of Education shall have the authority to condition the awarding of a high school diploma to a student upon achievement of satisfactory scores on instruments or tests adopted and administered by the State board pursuant to (a) of this code." The law further provides opportunities for students with disabilities "to take any test adopted by the State Board as a condition for awarding of a high school diploma" and to receive accommodations specified in their IEP as necessary for participation.

The Georgia High School Graduation Tests (GHSGT) assess only a sample of the knowledge and skills that educators agree comprise a complete high school education. Georgia students have opportunities to learn – and are expected to master – much more than the tests address. The state adopted curriculum is the source of the knowledge and skills assessed on the graduation tests.

Students take the GHSGT for the first time in the spring of the 11th grade. Schools use the results to identify students who need additional instruction in the academic content determined by Georgia educators as necessary for a high school diploma. Students who do not succeed on their first attempt have four additional opportunities to meet the standards prior to completing 12th grade.

Scores on the 2006 GHSGT administration increased in three of the four content areas from 2005. The greatest gains occurred in Science, in which Regular Program Grade 11 first-time test takers increased 5 percentage points, while Limited English Proficient (ELL) students increased 6 percentage points, and Special Education students increased 4 percentage points. Social Studies scores increased in all three subgroups as well: Regular Program Grade 11 first-time test takers increased 2 percentage points over 2005; Special Education students and Limited English Proficient (ELL) increased 3 percentage points. Scores in English Language Arts increased 1 percentage point for Regular Program students. Limited English Proficient (ELL) students increased by 7 percentage points while Special Education students increased 5 percentage points from 2005. Math scores remained consistent with 2005 scores for Regular Program and Special Education students while Limited English Proficient (ELL) students decreased by only 1 percentage point.

KEY FINDINGS

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

- A total of 80,255 Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the ELA test. Ninety-eight (98) percent
 met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 548. This is an increase from 2005 of 1 percentage point in
 the number of students passing on the first attempt.
- A total of **7,296** Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the ELA test. **Seventy-five (75)** percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of **518**. This is an **increase from 2005 of 5 percentage points** in the number of students passing on the first attempt.
- O A total of **1,447** Limited English Proficient/English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the ELA test. **Seventy-one** (71) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of **512**. This is an **increase from 2005 of 7 percentage points** in the number of students passing on the first attempt.

MATHEMATICS

- A total of 80,309 Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Mathematics test. Ninety-five (95) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 536. This number remains at the level achieved in 2005.
- O A total of **7,312** Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Mathematics test. **Fifty-eight (58)** percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of **505**. This number **remains at the level achieved in 2005**.
- O A total of **1,479** Limited English Proficient/English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Mathematics test. **Seventy-seven** (77) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of **516**. This is a **decrease from 2005 of 1 percentage point** in the number of students passing on the first attempt.

SOCIAL STUDIES

- A total of 79,929 Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Social Studies test. Eighty-nine (89) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 523. This is an increase from 2005 of 2 percentage points in the number of students passing on the first attempt.
- O A total of **7,212** Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Social Studies test. **Forty-nine** (49) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of **501**. This is an increase from **2005** of **3** percentage **point** in the number of students passing on the first attempt.
- A total of **1,438** Limited English Proficient/English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Social Studies test. **Forty-nine (49)** percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of **500**. This is an **increase from 2005 of 3 percentage points** in the number of students passing on the first attempt.

SCIENCE

- A total of **80,150** Regular Program Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Science test. **Seventy-six (76)** percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of **514**. This number is an **increase from 2005 of 5 percentage points** in the number of students passing on the first attempts.
- A total of 7,236 Special Education Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Science test. Thirty-five (35) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 492. This number is an increase from 2005 of 4 percentage points in the number of students passing on the first attempt.
- A total of 1,450 Limited English Proficient/English Language Learner Grade 11 First-time Test Takers took the Science test. Thirty-two (32) percent met the passing standard with a mean scale score of 492. This is an increase from 2005 of 6 percentage points in the number of students passing on the first attempt.

Percent Grade 11 First-time Test Takers Passing GHSGT English Language Arts, Spring Administration 2002-2006



Figure 2 Percent Grade 11 First-time Test Takers Passing GHSGT Mathematics, Spring Administration 2002 - 2006



Figure 3 Percent Grade 11First-time Test Takers Passing GHSGT Social Studies, Spring Administration 2002 - 2006



Percent Grade 11 First-time Test Takers Passing GHSGT Science, Spring Administration 2002 - 2006


