The Board of Education sets goals for the entire district. The district goals for 2022-2023 are:

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) American Literature and Composition End of Course (EOC) Assessment will in increase by three percentage points.

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones (GMAS) Algebra I End of Course (EOC) Assessment will increase by three percentage points.



School Goals

McIntosh County Academy will increase the percentage of students by 10% scoring Proficient or higher on the Algebra I Milestones EOC Assessment for the 2022-2023 school year.

McIntosh County Academy will increase the number of students reading on grade level as measured by a 5% on baseline MAP assessments for the 2022-2023 school year.

McIntosh County Academy will increase the percentage of students by 10% scoring Proficient or higher on all Milestone EOC Assessments for the 2022-2023 school year.

Increasing Math Skills

As a school — We will offer in-school and after-school tutoring for students who are struggling in the area of math, and offer research-based programs to supplement classroom instruction.


As a parent – I will stay informed of my child's progress in Math and provide transportation for after-school tutoring.

Increasing Writing Skills

As a school — We will provide research-based writing instruction in the classroom and offer detailed feedback to help facilitate the revision process for students, provide parents with quarterly updates on specific writing growth, and provide in-school and after-school tutoring in the area of writing.



As a student — Using the feedback my teacher provides, I will work with my teacher and parents to revise my assigned essays and attend tutoring when I am struggling in my class.



Increasing Reading Skills

As a school — We will provide specific research-based reading strategies for all students in all content areas, administer reading assessments and use data to guide our instruction, and offer in-school and after-school tutoring in the area of reading.

As a parent — I will make reading a priority and monitor internet time and limit usage if necessary, and provide transportation to after-school tutoring.

As a student — I will make reading a routine and learn ways to strengthen my reading skills.
