 - What type of Family Services/Support need by our school families?

Final Process Steps

- Analyzed Feedback from Conversation Circles to develop a Student Needs Assessment
- Followed Up with Faculty & Staff prior to administering the student survey
- Administered Survey to all 9th-12th students the week of December 2nd
- Identifying space & material priorities to meet student needs
- Identifying community organizations/partners to begin implementation of identified student needs

Suggestions from Student Conversation Circle/Focus Groups

Academic/Inside the classroom

- Make it a priority that student actually have hands-on interactive experience in the classroom (labs...)
- Look for ways to alter the teaching method from straight lecture to a more interactive exchange with student when possible
- Consider reviving the *In-class Teacher Assistant program* to assist slower students during class time
- Provide/Offer more college and business field trips/tours
- Provide workshops or presentations on careers, resumes, interviewing, job searching, choosing a college or major...
- Consider adding a study hall instead of tap time

School/Campus Climate

- Are we asking the right questions?
 - o (ex: late, absent, acting out, failing...) **instead of** why are you always late? Why are you absent so much? What's wrong with you? I've heard about you, you are a trouble maker! You are never going to graduate!.....
 - Say... "What's going on that causing you to miss school, or to act out? What's happening that's causing you to be late so much? Is there something I/We can possibly help with? Would you like to talk to someone about it? I/We want to help you succeed, we are here for you! Let's start with a clean slate! You have a bright future!
- School Spirit is lacking (consider on a temp/trial run)
 - Consider bringing back a school mascot, pep rallies, school dances, class spirit contests and awards/recognition
 - Update/repair the athletes locker rooms (they look prison like and embarrassingly run down)...paint, lighting, themed...
 - o Consider Food Trucks: Taco Tuesday or Wing Wednesday, TGIF Pizza Friday

Social/Emotional

- Considering motivational speakers (can be webinars...Ted Talks or in person) on overcoming obstacles (relatable to these students and their circumstances)
- Workshops on achievement, success
- Consider allowing peer support groups for self-esteem, body image, appreciating differences, bullying, etc.

Local Community Outreach/Resources

- More Local Transportation
- More local affordable childcare so kids don't have always babysit their siblings
- Parenting classes for adult parents of students
- More local jobs for parents

Proposal

Just recently established with New counselor- Ava Weaver

Wraparound / Student Services Network Group, consisting of: High School Counselor, Social Worker, Mental Health Rep, Wraparound Coordinators, School Nurse, Assistant Principal and family connections Rep) to coordinate all student crisis or emergency needs. This group would develop the systematic response protocol to address needs as they arise. This would include a main point of contact within the group to spearhead the process to avoid duplication of effort and delays in getting assistance and to be sure that the appropriate persons/experts are in the loop and notified.

- More field trips related to career/Business tours
- Would like thereto be study halls instead of tap or during tap
- Bring back Assistant Teacher or class helpers
- Want to learn about investing, money management
- More organized efforts to get to know others that are different (cultures, religion, etc)
- More opportunities to gain work experience while in school
- Help with how to change a negative mindset
- Help with shyness, self esteem
- Teen support groups for girls
- How to separate what happens at home from school
- Parenting classes for their parents
- More working opportunities for their parents
- Better/more public transportation
- Better paying jobs in the community for parents
- More day care services so that students wouldn't have to take on that full responsibility
