World Geography Five Themes of Geography Book Project

As an introduction to our study of World Geography this year, each student is required to complete a Five Themes of Geography Book Project. This is a two-part assignment and this sheet will provide you with the requirements and rubric for this project. Due date is: 8/27/12.

Title Page (4 points total):

- 1. Five Themes of Geography Project
- 2. The name of your country in large, attractive, letters on the cover.
- 3. Student's name
- 4. Period

Part 1 (10 points total):

Define each of the five themes of geography and provide an illustrated example of each theme. Pictures may be taken from the internet, cut out from a magazine, or drawn neatly by you.

Part 2 (36 points total):

Choose one country anywhere in the world and apply the five themes of geography to that country using the following requirements:

I. Location (8 points total):

- 1. Absolute Location of the capital city the exact location (described in latitude and longitude) (1pt)
- 2. Relative Location
 - a. What hemispheres are your country in? (1pt)
 - b. What continent is your country part of? (1pt)
 - c. What other countries are neighbors of your country? (Use cardinal directions. Ex: Canada is <u>north</u> of the United States) (1pt)
 - d. Describe two major features that are near your country. (Ex. The United States is borders both the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans) (2pts)
 - e. Include a map of your country (with the source) (2pts)

II. Place (12 points total):

- 1. Physical Features
 - a. What is the general shape of your country? (1pt)
 - b. What types of landforms are found? (mountains, rivers, deserts, etc...) (1pt)
 - c. What is the climate like? (average temperatures, amount of rainfall, etc...) (1pt)
 - d. What types of plants and animals are found? (2pts)
- 2. Human Features
 - a. Name three major man-made features. (3pts)
 - b. What, if any, are the major types of religions? (1pt)
 - c. What languages are spoken? (1pt)
 - d. Include a flag of your country and what the flag means. (2pts)

III. Human-Environment Interaction (6 points total):

- 1. How do people use the land? (farming, herding, mining, industries) (1pt)
- 2. What are two ways people adapt to the environment? (Ex. warmer clothes in cold climates) (2pts)
- 3. What are two ways people have changed the environment? (Ex. pollution, cutting trees, creating parks, etc...) (2pts)
- 4. Where do most people live? Why? (Ex. Most major cities are near bodies of water that were used for early trade) (1pt)

IV. Movement (5 points total):

- 1. What types of technologies are used to share ideas? (1pt)
- 2. What are the main methods of travel for people? (1pt)
- 3. What are the main goods that are exported (shipped to other countries)? (1pt)
- 4. What are the main goods that are imported (received from other countries)? (1pt)
- 5. Why would people leave or move to the country? (Ex. jobs, family, climate, war, etc.) (1pt)

V. Region (5 points total):

1. How is the country similar to any of its neighbors? List 5 similarities. (Ex. languages, types of government, climate, traditions, etc...). Basically, summarize what that *area* of the world is like that includes your country and surrounding areas.
