

Florida Civic Literacy Exam (FCLE) Frequently Asked Questions for K–12 Administration

General Information

What are the test dates for the Florida Civic Literacy Examination (FCLE) in the 2021–2022 school year?

The test will be offered in late fall/winter (October 25–December 17, 2021) and in the spring (April 11–May 27, 2022). Districts may choose local administration dates within these windows.

What standards is the test based on?

The assessment is based on the competencies and outcomes identified at <http://www.fldoe.org/policy/articulation/postsec-civics-lit.stml>. It is not tied to FSA or NGSSS standards.

Students to Be Tested

Who is required to take the FCLE?

According to section 1003.4282(3)(d), F.S., as amended by [Senate Bill 1108 \(2021\)](#), “Beginning with the 2021–2022 school year, students taking the United States Government course are required to take the assessment of civic literacy identified by the State Board of Education pursuant to s. 1007.25(4). Students earning a passing score on the assessment are exempt from the postsecondary civic literacy assessment required by s. 1007.25(4).” At this time, there is no alternate version of the test, so students in the Access U.S. Government course ([7921015](#)) are not required to participate. What grade level should be administered the FCLE?

There is no specified grade level for the test. Any student in grades 6–12 will be eligible if enrolled in the United States Government course. Students earning a passing score on the assessment are exempt from the postsecondary civic literacy assessment required by s. 1007.25(4), F.S.

Can any students take the test, even if they are not enrolled in a U.S. Government course?

This is up to the district's discretion. Only those students enrolled are required to take it.

Test Delivery System

What platform will the FCLE be administered on?

The FCLE will be administered on the Cambium Assessment, Incorporated (CAI) Test Delivery System (TDS) platform.

How do K–12 schools or districts enroll students for the test?

This test will be included with Winter EOC and Spring EOC administrations in TIDE. Similar to FSA/NGSSS, districts can upload a PreID file to make students eligible for the test or schools can manually enter students.

When does the PreID window open for the FCLE?

The PreID window for FCLE will open on October 4, 2021. The FCLE will be included with the Winter 2021 EOC administration in TIDE.

Are remote administrations permitted?

Remote administrations are not permitted for any K–12 statewide assessments, including the FCLE.

Test Preparation

What resources are available for test preparation?

Is there a practice test available for the FCLE?

At this time, there is no practice test available. If students would like to become familiar with the test platform, they may take a U.S. History or Civics End-of-Course (EOC) Assessment practice test available here: <https://flpt.tds.cambiumast.com/student/?a=Student>.

Test Administration

What resources are available for administration of the FCLE?

Schools will use the Fall/Winter 2021 ELA Retake & EOC Test Administration Manual for policy information.

The following resources will also be available:

How long is the test?

The FCLE will be one 160-minute session with a break at 80 minutes. Students may be dismissed at the break if they are finished. Students may have up to half a typical school day to continue working if they are not finished after 160 minutes.

How many and what type of items are on the FCLE?

The test consists of approximately 80 multiple-choice questions.

Will students receive CBT Worksheets for this assessment?

No, students will not receive any ancillary materials for the FCLE.

Accommodations

What accommodations are available for the test?

- In Fall 2021, the following accessibility tools and accommodations will be available:
 - Zoom
 - Color Contrast
 - Text-to-Speech
 - Masking
 - Print on Demand
- In Spring 2022, additional accommodations will be available such as regular print, large print, one-item-per-page, and printed braille tests.

Will an accommodated script be available?

Yes, a CBT accommodated script will be available on the Florida Statewide Assessments Portal.

Scoring and Reporting

What score information will students, teachers, schools and districts receive?

Raw score information will be available immediately after tests are completed and results will be delivered through the APM Reporting System. Districts and schools will also receive DRS and SRS files.

What is a passing score on the assessment?

In accordance with the [Board of Governors \(BOG\) Regulation 8.006 Civic Literacy](#), the passing score on the FCLE (referred to as the “U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Naturalization Test – Civics [U.S. history and government] with supplemental questions” within the Regulation) is 60% correct. This passing score will apply to K–12 and Florida College System as well, pending FCS State Board Rule change.

How will the K–12 student’s passing score be transmitted to postsecondary institutions to show they have met the assessment requirement?

K–12 school districts can submit students’ scores through Survey 5 uploads, in the Appendix I and L databases.

Will the FCLE be tied to accountability or school grades?

Students earning a passing score on the assessment are exempt from the postsecondary civic literacy assessment required by s. 1007.25(4), F.S. There are no other statewide implications for accountability or school grades.

May a student retake the test to attempt to make a passing score?

Examinees must wait 30 days before attempting to retake the FCLE in order to allow for remediation prior to retesting.

How many times may a student retake the test in a school year?

Students will have two opportunities per window (fall and spring).

Will the FCLE be used to calculate a final grade for course?

This is not indicated in the statutory language. It will not be required to count as 30% of the student's course grade.
