3. Overall Summer Program Narrative

9. Please provide a summary of your summer program. Include a description of the population you served and the type of services provided.

Reinforcement of reading skills were provided in the summer. Paraprofessionals and teachers working as paraprofessionals supported student growth with in-home visits where a research-based curriculum was delivered. Paraprofessionals delivered materials designed by a certified teacher to enhance and supplement instruction to continue school year activities and prepare for the next year. Pre and Post-tests were administered to provide evidence of growth. Additionally, credit recovery opportunities were provided for secondary students in need through Edgeniuty both online and in the school setting. Forty-seven students received services over the summer including one 9th grader who retrieved a half credit of Biology I that they failed during hybrid classes during COVID. The other 46 students received in-home intensive reading instruction and consisted of 7 pre-k, 11 kindergarten, 3 first grade, 2 second grade, 1 third grade, 4 fourth grade, 7 fifth grade, 4 sixth grade, 2 seventh grade, 2 eighth grade, and an additional ninth grade student.

10. What are some highlights of your summer program? For example, include a description of students' favorite activities, notable successful events, new partnerships formed, etc.

One of our teachers working as a summer paraprofessional provided services to a ninth-grader completing in-person credit recovery at the local high school on Edgenuity. This strengthened our relationship with the administration at the high school and they appreciated the tutoring the teacher was able to provide enabling the student to successfully recover the credit they were lacking due to COVID. Other popular activities that students enjoyed included read aloud and choral reading of poetry with the in-home paraprofessional. Students also practiced their oral English language skills through hands-on activities and games.

11. What modifications to your summer program, if any, did your district make due to COVID-19, including changes in response to regular school year disruptions or changes in worker migration?

Program modifications due to COVID included providing PPE and hand sanitizer to our paraprofessionals and families. Additionally, supplies were provided to each family so that paraprofessionals were not taking supplies from home to home for students to use. Due to so many of our students missing a lot of school during the 2020-2021 school year due to illness or quarantine requirements and/or participated in school remotely, we focused our summer program on improving reading skills and credit recovery for students that failed a course.

12. Please summarize the outcomes obtained by your summer program.

The Suwannee County School District Summer Migrant Education Program had great summer success. Out of the 47 participants, one student attempted and completed credit recovery of semester one of Biology I, and 38 in-home service students completed pre- and post-test data. Eight students moved before completing their post-test. Thirty-one of the 38 students that completed the pre- and post-tests showed growth with an average increase of 8.23 percentage points overall.

Our summer program worked with the on-site credit recovery program at Suwannee High School for a student to retrieve credit they didn't successfully complete during the school year due to COVID. Additionally, we worked with a local church to provide food for a migrant family in need.

15. Describe any challenges and/or lessons learned regarding summer program participation and service delivery.

Most of our summer participants do not speak much English and truly need bilingual paraprofessionals to provide their summer reading instruction. In our area, we have a very limited number of bilingual paraprofessionals or teachers available to work in the summer to provide in-home services. This summer, 2 of the 4 people we hired to work with families only spoke English so we had to carefully match them with more English proficient students. Our bilingual recruiter and data clerk provided assistance when communication was necessary with the parents.

38 out of 46 students completed the program. 31 out of the 38 students who completed both the pre- and post-tests on reading showed growth. The overall average growth was 8.23 percentage points. The range of percentage points growth was from -30 to +40.

The students that did not complete the summer program moved before they completed their post-test.
