Panter Elementary School's Math Milestones scores will increase from 39.3% proficient or distinguished in 2016 to 45% in 2017.

✓ In 1st grade our school will focus on developing addition and subtraction fluency.

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment will increase by 1.5 percentage points.

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestones Mathematics End of Grade Assessment will increase by 1.5 percentage points.

In the First Grade Classroom

The 1st Grade team will work with students and their families to help students achieve academic success in reading and math in the following ways:

- ✓ Provide parents with comprehension questions for daily reading.
- ✓ Provide addition and subtraction flashcards at conferences.
- ✓ Provide parents with a list of sight words to keep in their child's weekly communication folder.
- Encourage parents to visit the Parent Resource Center and to attend monthly parent meetings and family learning nights.

At Home

Panter School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math:

- ✓ Listen to my child read each night and ask comprehension questions about the story.
- ✓ Spend 5 minutes working on my child's addition and subtraction fact fluency using flashcards.
- ✓ Have my child read the sight word list in the communication folder each night.
- ✓ Visit the Parent Resource Center and attend monthly parent meetings and family learning nights.

Panter Elementary Students

Panter School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- ✓ Read to an adult each night and answer questions about the story.
- ✓ Practice my addition and subtraction flashcards with an adult each night for at least 5 minutes.
- ✓ Practice a list from my sight word sheet each night with an adult.
- ✓ Encourage my parents to visit the Parent Resource Center to check out games and materials to support learning at home. Remind them about monthly parent meetings and family learning nights.
