## **Assessment Division Goal**

We will provide well-designed assessments, aligned to the curriculum, with timely delivery of useful results.



## **Assessment Updates**

- The duration of the testing windows for 2010-2011 are being reviewed and will be tightened
- CRCT 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade Social Studies will receive scores in 2010
- GHSGT
  - Social Studies GPS based form will be administered in Spring 2010
  - Mathematics items being field tested in the EOCT for 2011 Mathematics portion of GH\$G

## **Assessment Updates**

- Alternate Assessment based on Modified Achievement Standards (2% test for qualified students with IEPs)
  - Development is continuing
  - Upcoming informational sessions TBA
- GHSGT AYP calculations
  - Beginning discussions with US ED to calculate using first-time test takers as opposed to first-time grade 11 test takers

### **EOCT - Mathematics I and II**

- Standards will be set this year results for Winter administration will be delayed
  - Standard setting will occur in January 2010
  - Scores available end of January 2010
- 2008-2009 administrations considered field test
  - Mathematics I items released with reports at state, system, and school levels

#### **EOCT – Mathematics I and II**

#### 2009-2010 will be operational

- 62 items (54 operational and 8 field test)
- Weighting remains the same
  - Algebra35%
  - Geometry35%
  - Data Analysis and Probability30%



## **Assessment Updates**

- Secondary Redesign
  - Conversation continues regarding the move toward EOCTs and phasing out GHSGT
- GAA development for high school students to include courses assessed by EOCTs.
  - Access courses in core content are required for graduation for students with significant cognitive disabilities



## **Assessment Updates**

- NAEP Writing pilot assessment will occur during 2010. This
  pilot will be computerized for 8th and 12th graders; paper and
  pencil still for 4th graders.

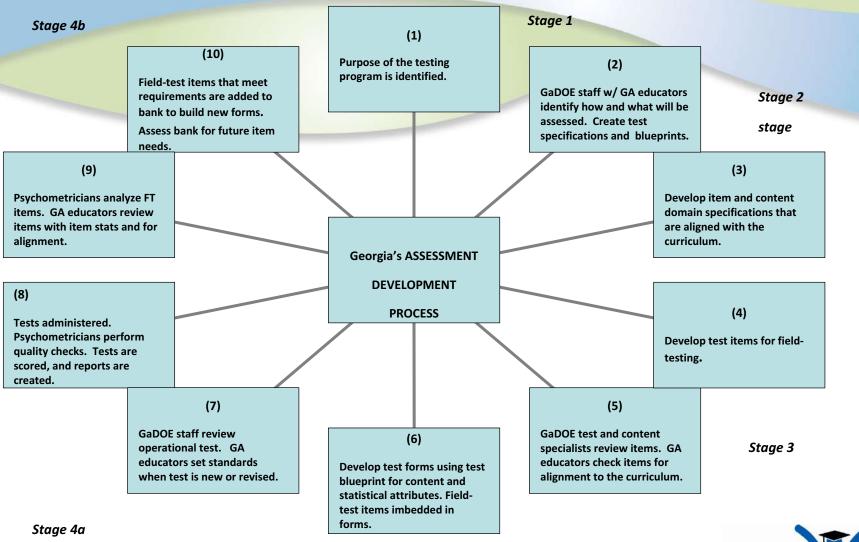

## **Focus: Testing Security**

- Advanced Planning
- Clear and concise communication about roles and responsibilities
- Solid logistical procedures
- Documented training



#### **CODE OF ETHICS FOR GEORGIA EDUCATORS 2009**

- The Professional Standards Commission (PSC) adopted a new Code of Ethics for Georgia Educators in July 2009.
- All educators should review the new Code of Ethics.
- The PSC also adopted a hierarchy of consequences, recommended by System Test Coordinators, that is published on their web site at <a href="http://gapsc.com">http://gapsc.com</a>

- **Standard 11:** Testing An educator shall administer state-mandated assessments fairly and ethically.
- Unethical conduct includes but is not limited to:
  - 1. committing any act that breaches Test Security;
     and
  - 2. compromising the integrity of the assessment.



## **Test Security Reminders**

- Be familiar with the Student Assessment Handbook and test administration manuals
- Follow all protocols
  - Principal's Certification Form is now required and must be maintained at the system for 5 years
- Report problems in a timely manner
  - Including referrals to PSC

#### Tier 3 - SST-Oriven Learning:

In addition to Tier 1 and Tier 2, targeted students participate in learning that is different by including - intensive, formalized problem solving to identify individual student needs. Targeted research based interventions tailored to inclividual needs. Prequent progress monitoring and analysis of student response to intervention(s).

#### Tier 2 - Needs-Based Learning:

In addition to Tier 1, targeted students participate in learning that is different by including: - Standard intervention protocol process for identifying and providing research based interventions based on need and resources.

- On-going progress monitoring to measure student response to intervention and guide decision-making.

#### Tier 1 - Standards-Based Classroom Learning:

All students participate in general education learning that includes:

- Universal screenings to target groups in need of specific instructional and/or behavioral support.
- Implementation of the Georgia Performance Standards (GPS) through a standards-based classroom structure.
- Differentiation of instruction including: fluid, flexible grouping, multiple means of learning, and demonstration
  of learning.
   Progress monitoring of learning through multiple formative assessments.
  - Positive behavior supports.
