Gulf High School has been selected to house the International Baccalaureate Program for the west side of Pasco County. It is a tremendous honor for this program to be at our school. The International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IB) offers highachieving, high-performing students an opportunity to pursue a rigorous program of studies during their high school years. The academic requirements of the IB program are rigorous and demanding. However, the student with an IB diploma or certificate may be awarded college credit and advanced standing at colleges and universities throughout the world. The Pre-International Baccalaureate Diploma Program will begin the fall of the 2005-06 school year (9th grade students only).

Dr. Deborah J. Lepley has been hired as an Assistant Principal at Gulf High School. She will head the IB program. She attended The Ohio State University for her B.A.E. and M.A. degrees, and received a Ph.D.in Visual Arts from Pennsylvania State University. She has held several adjunct positions to include Florida State University, Univ. of Maryland-European Divsion and St. Leo. She served as a soldier in the U.S. Army with the 101st Airborne Division - Air Assault. Dr. Lepley was a Fulbright recipient and has lived in Europe for a total of 3 years. She has taught visual arts at Ridgewood High School and has served as an Assistant Principal of Student Services. We welcome her to our school.

Applications are available from your student's guidance counselor at school. If your student is not currently attending a Pasco County middle school, the application must include a copy of 7th

and 8th grade transcripts and also a copy of standardized test scores (SAT or Iowa Test of Basic Skills, etc.) from the 7th grade. Please submit the application on or before December 16th at Land O' Lakes High School. The writing sample will be given at Land O'Lakes High School on January 8th, 8:30-9:30 AM (Saturday).
