Agricultural Science

Evaluate how the debate over social, political, and environmental issues related to agricultural development efforts abroad may impact agriculture in the U.S. The length of your response should be 500 words or less.

Communicative Arts

Literary Analysis - The poems below, one published in 1789 and the other in 1794, were written by William Blake in response to the conditions of chimney sweeps in England. Small children were often forced inside chimneys to clean (sweep) their interiors. Read the two poems carefully. Then, in a well-written essay, compare and contrast the two poems, taking into consideration the poetic techniques (e.g. diction, imagery, figurative language, syntax, tone, details, point of view) and sound devices (e.g. alliteration, assonance, consonance, rhyme, meter) Blake uses in each. Type your response in the box below the poems. The length of your response should be no more than 1000 words.

The Chimney Sweeper (1789)

When my mother died I was very young, And my father sold me while yet my tongue Could scarcely cry " 'weep! 'weep! 'weep! 'weep!" So your chimneys I sweep & in soot I sleep.

There's little Tom Dacre, who cried when his head That curled like a lamb's back, was shaved, so I said, "Hush, Tom! never mind it, for when your head's bare, You know that the soot cannot spoil your white hair."

And so he was quiet, & that very night, As Tom was a-sleeping he had such a sight! That thousands of sweepers, Dick, Joe, Ned, & Jack, Were all of them locked up in coffins of black;

And by came an Angel who had a bright key, And he opened the coffins & set them all free; Then down a green plain, leaping, laughing they run, And wash in a river and shine in the Sun.

Then naked & white, all their bags left behind, They rise upon clouds, and sport in the wind. And the Angel told Tom, if he'd be a good boy, He'd have God for his father & never want joy.

And so Tom awoke; and we rose in the dark And got with our bags & our brushes to work. Though the morning was cold, Tom was happy & warm; So if all do their duty, they need not fear harm.

The Chimney Sweeper (1794)

A little black thing among the snow, Crying "weep! 'weep!" in notes of woe! "Where are thy father and mother? say?" "They are both gone up to the church to pray.

Because I was happy upon the heath, And smil'd among the winter's snow, They clothed me in the clothes of death, And taught me to sing the notes of woe.

And because I am happy and dance and sing, They think they have done me no injury, And are gone to praise God and his Priest and King, Who make up a heaven of our misery.'

Engineering

(Design, Mechatronics/Mechanical-Electrical Engineering, and Software Engineering) Propose a specific engineering problem with a possible technology solution you would like to be working on ten years from now. Why is the problem interesting, and how do you hope to approach it? The length of your response should be 500 words or less.
Mathematics Discovery is the hallmark of mathematics. Submit a short essay discussing an important discovery in the field of mathematics and the impact it has had on the field. The length of your response should be 500 words or less.
Science Submit a short essay discussing an idea in science that you find fascinating. Include why it intrigues you. You may choose a topic as general as a whole discipline or as specific as a particular phenomenon, challenge, or innovation. The length of your response should be 500 words or less.
Social Studies Submit a short essay discussing the following: Why the study of international political matters should be important to Americans. The length of your response should be 500 words or less.
World Languages (French, German, Latin, Mandarin Chinese, Spanish) Submit a short essay written in the language in which you are applying. Address the following questions in your response: What historic or cultural aspect(s) of the language have you enjoyed learning about or would like to learn about? How might GHP help you use the language in the future? The length of your response should be 500 words or less.
