Gifted Children with ADHD/ADD

Characteristics of Gifted Children with ADHD/ADD

- ➤ Short attention span UNLESS attending to an area of passion
- Constant movement (ADHD) or daydreaming (ADD)
- Easily frustrated at long tasks/assignments
- Miss simple test items but not complex items
- Deficient in note-taking, outlining, pre-writing, and writing
- > Deficient in social behaviors

Potential Challenges in School

- Cannot independently complete long-term projects
- ➤ Know they KNOW the information but cannot attend to lengthy tasks/lectures
- > Easily frustrated

Suggested Interventions, If Needed:

- ➤ Break down assignments for ADHD Gifted
- ➤ Model the breaking down of assignments for ADHD Gifted, and remind them to break down assignments.
- Remove from distractions. Move student to front side of classroom away from doorway
- ➤ Get support from mentor and/or school counselor
